

The Freedom 35 was designed by David Pedrick, longtime Naval Architect and Yacht Designer for Sparkman and Stephens. It was first built in 1993. “Misty Morn” is the 1997 model. She has had indoor storage all her life and has received excellent maintenance.

The freestanding 54’ carbon fiber mast is a distinct feature of the Freedom 35. It is self-supporting as the top bends off in a gust so the crew does not have to ease the traveler or mainsheet as much as with a traditional rig. The large mainsail is fully battened and roached, hoisted by a power winch. The free standing mast design allows for wide decks, unencumbered by stays, backstay, and chain plates. “Misty Morn” is equipped with a roller furling jib that is self tacking and easily handed from the cockpit. Her sails are original and include a colorful spinnaker. She has a shoal wing keel with a 4’6” draft allowing her to cruise in shallow waters.

The Freedom 35 is a delight to sail, the main and the jib are essentially self-tacking. All lines are able to be handled from the cockpit.

Below decks, the sole is teak and holly. The cabinetry is a warm honey colored cherry. The saloon table seats 6. There are several portals and sky lights that let in ample natural light providing a bright, inviting below deck environment.

The galley is on the port side of the companionway. It includes a double sink, large ice chest, drink cooler, and a Force 10 propane powered two burner stove with an oven. The cabin V berth sleeps 2 and the aft cabin sleeps 2 in a double bed. The main cabin couch on the port side pulls out into another comfortable sleeping berth. The starboard cabin seating area is also large enough for a bed for a child. The head is conveniently situated just starboard to the companion way and includes a shower with a pump. The cabin can be heated by a propane heater.

The Yanmar 27 HP diesel drives the boat while conserving fuel. The engine is easily accessed for maintenance and service within the main cabin.

“Misty Morn’s” cockpit is wide and roomy and includes a drop down cocktail table. The large wheel can be folded inward to increase maneuverability in the cockpit when moored or at anchor. The cockpit is equipped with attractive, comfortable closed cell white cushions. She is also equipped with a full cockpit

screen enclosure so that the crew can enjoy bug free evenings. A propane powered barbecue is included.

“Misty Morn” has a convenient step through transom with a “sugar scoop” swim platform making it very easy to get in and out of the dinghy.

Overall, the Freedom 35 “Misty Morn” delivers a lot of value for the dollar and big return in the enjoyment of sailing. She is a wonderful choice for family cruising!
