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Mission & Purpose

WHERE YOUTH VOICES INSPIRE COMMUNITY CHANGE

The Youth Advisory Council (YAC) is a youth-led leadership body that serves as the official voice of young people within the Overtown Children & Youth Coalition (OCYC). Ages 14-24. Who either live, attend school or receive programming in the Overtown Community. The council provides youth with meaningful opportunities to influence decisions, contribute and volunteer in community initiatives, develop leadership skills, and advocate for issues affecting children, youth, and families. The purpose of the YAC is to ensure that youth perspectives are included in the planning, implementation, and evaluation of programs, policies, events, and initiatives of the OCYC Coalition at large that impact their lives and communities. Through engagement, advocacy, service, and leadership development, YAC members become active partners in creating positive change throughout Overtown and beyond.

We act honestly, ethically, responsibly, and with accountability.

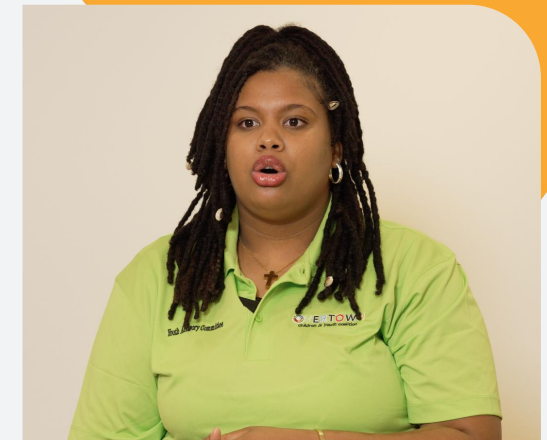
Collaboration

Members brought youth perspective into coalition conversations and surfaced the priorities that matter most.



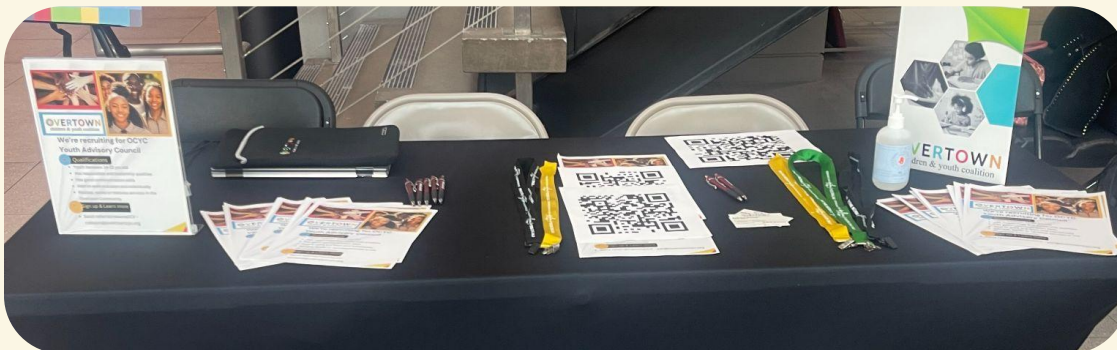
Advocacy in practice

3 of 4 members reported that YAC helped them advocate for social issues they care about — from education access to community investment.

3 of 4 gained deeper knowledge of Overtown — its history, its assets, and the systems that shape opportunity.



From participants to leaders

Across the year, members moved from attending programming to running it — introducing speakers, recruiting peers, and representing OCYC where decisions about Overtown's youth get made.



PROFESSIONAL DEVELOPMENT

The Power of Self-Awareness and Self-Actualization

The first-ever YAC Professional Development Session — facilitated by Delvin Rogers at the OYC & FLHAT Hospitality Expo — gave members a framework for understanding their own strengths, motivations, and goals.



4 of 4 grew in self-awareness and goal-setting

3 of 4 built professional networks and relationships

2 of 4 learned to tailor a resume effectively

Showing up for Overtown, in Overtown

YAC members were OCYC's most persuasive recruiters. By staffing tables, promoting programming, and talking to peers at coalition and community events, they expanded awareness of what the Council is and who it's for.

Event staffing

Members staffed and promoted OCYC at community events, becoming the face of the coalition for other young people.

Peer recruitment

Direct outreach expanded awareness of YAC opportunities and built the pipeline for next year's cohort.

Coalition participation

Members joined coalition activities and community initiatives alongside partner organizations.



A 100% graduation rate — and a plan for every graduate

4 of 4

members graduated high school in 2026 — and all four are enrolling in college.

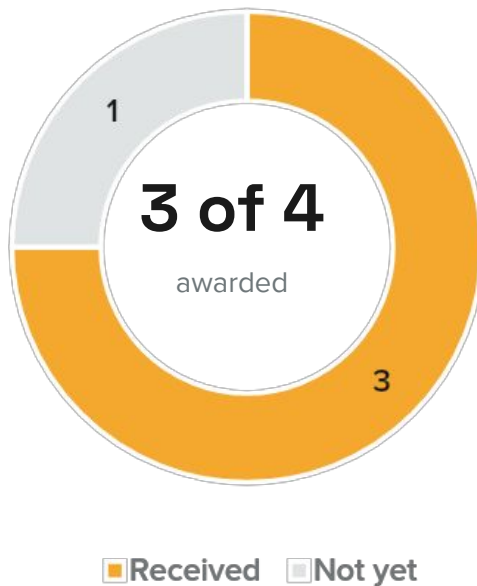

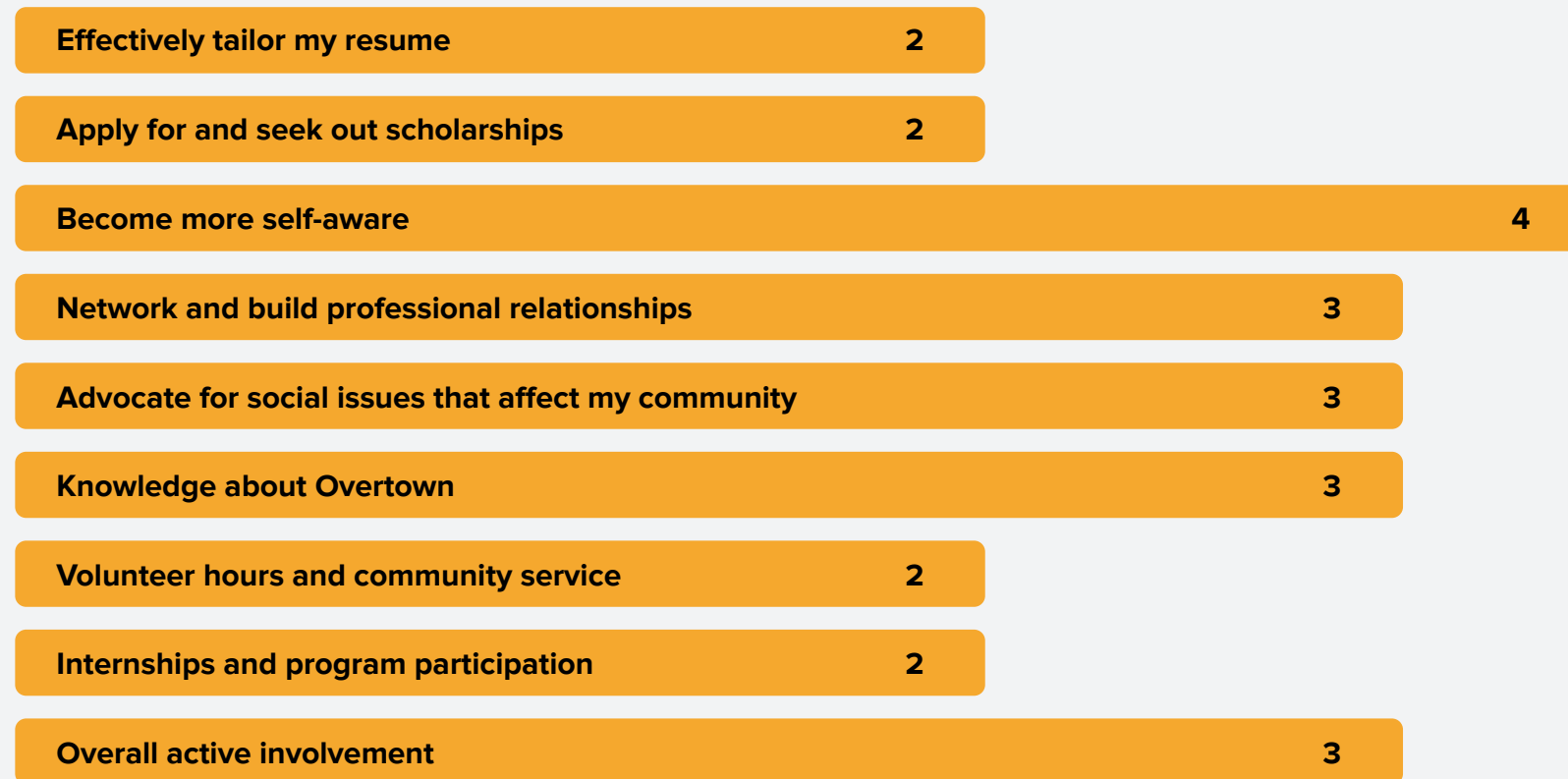

They're staying — and the Council is growing

3 of 4

members want to continue serving on the Council — the fourth asked for more information. No member said no.

Retention is the clearest signal a youth program can send. Going into 2026–2027, OCYC will build on a cohort that wants to stay — deepening what they've started and widening the door for the next group.

Priorities for 2026–2027

- 01 Retention & engagement**
Keep returning members active and deepen their leadership roles.
- 02 Leadership & workforce development**
Expand paid, credentialed, and hands-on career pathways.
- 03 College, career & entrepreneurship exposure**
Increase access to campuses, employers, and founders.
- 04 Youth-led initiatives**
Fund and support projects designed by youth, for Overtown.
