CEO's Message

After the lull of the Covid years, it was encouraging to see life returning to normal and Raphael buzzing with people and activities.

We are grateful to our donors for their generous support that enabled us to renovate and refurbish the Hospital, the Girls' hostel and also the Vocational Training Centre. The girls were delighted to come back to a freshly painted building with somewhat modern toilets and a fiber glass covered courtyard to enjoy the sun in the winter months.

The vocational training centre saw a spurt of activity; this year the candle and diya workshop made over 25000 diyas and not one was left unsold. Raphael's diyas are known in Dehradun for being amongst the best and every year we have a huge demand from institutions and individuals. This year, the Welham Boys School ordered 8400 diyas. With the introduction of training in hospitality skills, our young adults can be seen taking orders from staff and parents so that they can prepare the snacks for the day.

The hospital shut down during the Covid years as we could not take the slightest risk of infection on the campus. TB patients were amongst the most neglected everywhere and they were relieved when our gates re-opened. Raphael is a government designated Directly Observed Treatment Short Course (DOTs) Centre. The TB Control Programme is run in accordance with guidelines laid down in the National Tuberculosis Elimination Programme (NTEP).

The leprosy cured patients living on campus in Shiv Sadan are getting frail as they age but most are in reasonably good health. We have lost 3 residents this year and also admitted two new residents.

We have been fortunate to receive sufficient funding this year but the coming years are starting to look bleak. CSR funding is becoming more difficult especially post Covid and we will have to strive hard to cover our deficit without having to dip into funds reserved for rainy days.

Chairman of the Governing Council for five years, Lt. Gen R K Nanavatty (Retd.) completed his tenure on 31 March 23. It was a pleasure to work with him. Known for his meticulousness he refined Raphael's writing of reports and returns, which will stand us in good stead for years to come. Lt Gen PC Bhardwaj (Retd) also stepped down as Vice-Chairman at the same time. We wish them both well and know that they will continue to be dedicated friends of Raphael. We welcome Ms Sunita Garware, familiar and much—loved figure, as the new Chairperson of Raphael's Governing Council.

No words are enough to thank our donors, overseas and Indian, institutional and individual, for their generous support towards our cause to provide relief to the suffering.

The Commandant Military Hospital, Dehradun and District Chief Medical Officer, Dehradun are permanent ex-officio members on the Council.

In the Governing Council meeting held on 30 March 2023, Lt. Gen. RK Nanavatty (Retd.) announced that he had completed his five-year tenure as Chairman and would be stepping down. Ms Sunita Garware will take over as Chairperson Raphael Governing Council with effect 1st April 23. Lt. Gen. PC Bhardwaj (Retd.) handed over the post of Vice- Chairman of the Council to Lt. Gen V K Ahluwalia (Retd.)

Special Education

Activities take place both on and off campus. **On-campus** services include residential and day care, early intervention and school-readiness, physiotherapy, speech and occupational therapy, vocational training and a teacher training centre. There is a huge demand for our services. In this last year, there have been 175 enquiries for admission to the hostel and school. Currently there are 160 residents and 44 day scholars (including the early intervention, school readiness and day centre).





The Principal Special School has successfully completed a 6 month course by Keystone India Ltd. on Social Role Valorization, that is, useful ideas to make positive changes in the lives of persons with disability. Our congratulations to her.

The vocational centre was refurbished and given a brand new look. Students over the age of

18 years are taught skills in keeping with their abilities. These include paper bag making, diya and candle making, domestic and housekeeping chores to include cleaning, dusting, shopping, making weekly menus with recipes, cooking and serving.



In August, an 'Early Intervention and School Readiness' programme was set up in the existing Therapeutic Centre. The objective of the programme is to create awareness in the community about the importance of early identification and intervention. Awareness pamphlets were distributed and 4 Helpdesks have been set up in doctors' clinics. Since attempts at inclusion of children with developmental disabilities have not met with success, a pre-nursery and nursery class catering to about 10 children each have been created. It is intended to extend this to class 1. The most exciting part of this project is the sensory park. Play is central to learning and development for all children and also helps to develop social skills. The children can't wait for their time in this park.







The teacher training centre conducted 28 in -service trainings this year. The two-year full-time Diploma in Special Education (Intellectual and Developmental Disabilities) 2022-24 had an intake of 17 students.


Two Continuing Rehabilitation in Education (CRE) programmes approved by Rehabilitation Council of India, were conducted on 'Recent Developments in Developmental Disabilities: Debate and Dilemmas' in May 2022 and 'Transition from School to work: Developing Social Skills for Transition' in January 2023. The programmes were attended by a total of 69 special educators from other organizations.



The off-campus activities include three types of mobile outreach programmes: A, B & C.

Outreach A works in 5 blocks of Dehradun district providing intervention to children with developmental disabilities enrolled in the government anganwadis, primary schools and based at home. Raphael has

set up early intervention centres in Mehuwala, Jattowala and Nayagaon on the Shimla Bypass road.



Outreach B works with the other districts in Uttarakhand barring Pithoragarh. This programme is conducted in collaboration with 'Uttarakhand Sabhi Ke Liye Shiksha.' Approximately 11000 stakeholders have been sensitized and about 4500 children identified through this programme since its inception.



Outreach C refers to the 'District Support Programmes' that Raphael has initiated in the districts marked in the map above. Presently 25 children are being reached in the two blocks through two locally trained resource persons who visit the homes in a cluster-based approach.

Main events of the year

Raphael celebrated its 63rd **Founders' Day** on 05 April 2022. The Chief Guest on the occasion was Admiral VL Koppikar (Retd.), PVSM, AVSM, who was associated with Raphael actively as Governing Council member for 16 years from 2001 to 2017.

The programme commenced with a welcome speech by Chairman of the Governing Council, Lt. Gen. RK Nanavatty (Retd). The students performed dances based on themes from different states while the teachers performed a dance based on Kashmir and its beauty. Students from Doon Girls School also performed a dance to add to the fervour of the program. Parents of some of the students enrolled in the Special Education Programme spoke about their experience and journey with Raphael.

The programme concluded with an appreciation for the staff who have completed 25 years at Raphael. The guests proceeded to enjoy tea and conversation concluding yet another successful Founders' Day celebration.

Intensive one-week training sessions for parents of children with developmental disability living in remote areas commenced in September 2022 and since then four families have availed of this service. The families are provided free board and lodging. These families are identified through Raphael's outreach programmes.

On 29th October some students participated in the district level dance competition which was held at ONGC Dehradun. It was a **Divyangotsav** event. Our students were delighted when they were announced as the winners!



Raphael celebrated **Dussehra** with much enthusiasm from making the effigies to decorations and enacting Ram Leela. All festivals such as Holi, Diwali, Raksha Bandhan, Eid, Christmas are celebrated so that the students learn about all religions. Christmas was particularly exciting this year as a kind donor sponsored a chowmein and momo lunch for all students and staff.





November 14 is celebrated as **Children's Day** every year in India and it is the Annual Sports' Day at Raphael. Races and games were arranged for the children ensuring that all could take part. The highlight of the programme was the staff versus students' cricket match.

In February 23 the students of the Doon School invited our cricket team to a 'friendly' cricket match. Our students surpassed all expectations; both teams consisted of students from both schools and it was a great experience for all. Raphael students were then invited by Oasis school to play basketball with their students.









1st March 23 was celebrated as **International Wheelchair Day**. The chief guest was Mr. Philip Burrett. The games included a wheelchair dance, wheelchair track race, wheelchair cricket and a ball game.







A two-day **Artificial limb camp** was organised at Raphael in collaboration with Shree Bhagwan Mahavir Viklang Sahayta Samiti on 16 and 17 March 23. A total of 163 appliances were distributed to 94 beneficiaries of which 60 were children.



On **Down Syndrome Day**, 21 March 2023, the students, residents and the staff of Raphael dressed in yellow and blue and did an awareness walk. The buildings too were lit up in yellow and blue.



Raphael is the first and perhaps still the only school for children with intellectual disabilities enrolled



with International Award for Young People (IAYP). 23 students completed the residential project and adventure journey on $27^{th} - 29^{th}$ March at Maldevta. They did activities like Burma Bridge, river crossing, double rope crossing, commando net, knot tying and a small trek.

Some of them also helped with cooking. These students have achieved gold, silver and bronze medals and these will be awarded to them on Raphael's Founders' Day





Tuberculosis (TB) Control Programme

We more than gratefully acknowledge Dr. Kalhan's selfless devotion to the hospital for a year. He has created a Mini-ICU in the existing hospital. Through his contacts he had a Maruti Van donated to Raphael for the use of the hospital.





The provisional registration under Clinical Establishment Act has been extended upto March 2024.



In this last one year 2169 patients attend the outpatient department and 131 TB patients were admitted to the hospital.

Life Long Care

As on 31 March 23 there are 24 leprosy cured persons living on campus and 32 persons with intellectual disabilities who are also in our permanent care.
