Visitor information

- Free electric barbecues. No bookings required.
- Swimming is only allowed in the wading pool. The pool is free, open in summer and supervised by lifeguards.
- Picnic shelters and amphitheatres available for hire for group functions.
- Please do not feed the wildlife.
- Visitors are not allowed to use their own water craft on the lake.
- Parking fees apply at Emerald Lake Park. Buy individual tickets on arrival from ticket machines or purchase an annual pass (available for residents and non-residents) from Emerald Lake Cafe.

Opening times

- Both parks open every day except CFA declared Extreme or Code Red days of total fire ban
- Vehicle access 6am–6pm (May to October) and 6am–8pm (November to April)
- Emerald Lake Park: cafe, model railway, paddleboats and Puffing Billy Railway closed Christmas Day

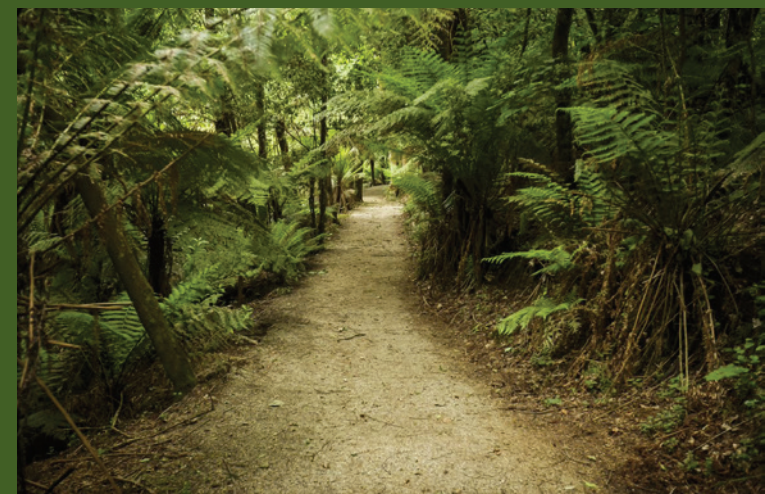

Emerald Lake Park

Explore walking trails around the lakes, along fern gullies and through eucalypt forests. Picnic on the lawns or hire a space or shelter for a wedding or special occasion. Fish from the lake, splash in the wading pool or challenge yourself in the playground or on the fitness equipment. Wherever you are, you will be surrounded by vistas of spectacular ornamental trees.

Nobelius Heritage Park

Explore beautiful heritage gardens or picnic with family and friends. Discover the history of Nobelius Nursery, including the heritage listed Nobelius Packing Shed on the Puffing Billy Railway. Nobelius Heritage Park is tranquil and private, making it a perfect venue for small weddings and events.

Emerald and District Museum

Set in Nobelius Heritage Park, Emerald and District Museum tells the story of Emerald's colourful past through displays of memorabilia, photographs and documents; dating from First Nation people to the present day.

Puffing Billy Railway

Puffing Billy Railway is one of Australia's oldest and best-preserved heritage steam railways; built in 1900 to carry passengers, timber, livestock, potatoes and plants. Now a non-profit tourist attraction, the train carries passengers in open carriages on the original mountain track through beautiful countryside, from Belgrave train station to Emerald Lake Park and Gembrook.

Visit the Puffing Billy Lakeside Visitor Centre (scheduled to open in 2021) to learn more about the railway and the region. Free entry. Indoor and outdoor dining options available.
