Editorial

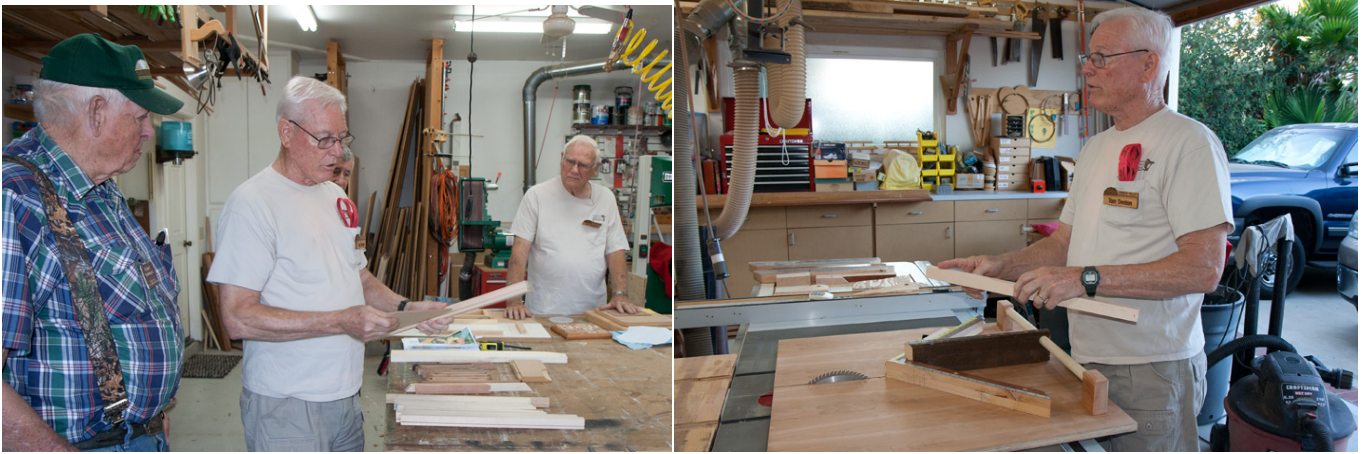

About Some Of Our Members

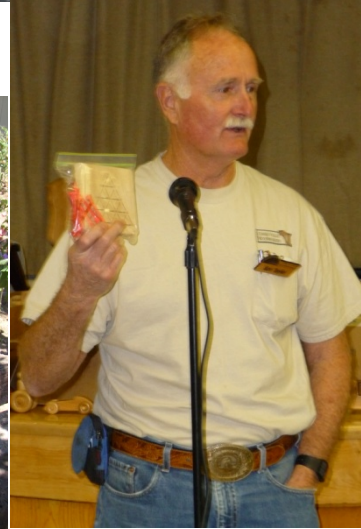
