

Your cost of attendance (COA) is an estimate of the expenses you may incur while attending Universal Technical Institute (UTI). The COA includes direct expenses such as tuition, fees, books, course materials, supplies, and equipment. Indirect expenses such as living expenses, including food and housing, transportation, and other personal miscellaneous expenses. In conjunction with the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) and/or other agencies, UTI uses the cost of attendance budgets to help determine a student's eligibility for financial aid.

Costs vary by campus, program, and are subject to change without notice. UTI's catalog addendum lists the current tuition at each campus. The Cost of Attendance budget outlined below shows the average expense per student as reported on College Board.
