



2026 Technicians in STEM Grant Program

Grant Amount: \$2,000

Objective:

Universal Technical Institute is offering a Grant Program known as the Technicians in STEM Grant Program to promote our ongoing commitment to supporting STEM education programs and careers.

Criteria for awarding the grant:

This grant program is available to enrolled students. Full eligibility details are listed below.

Eligibility Details:

- Applicant must be scheduled to graduate or have graduated from high school in the 2025/2026 academic year.
- Applicant must be enrolled to attend Universal Technical Institute with a start date that falls between January 30, 2026, and September 30, 2026.
- Technicians in STEM Grant application must be submitted prior to starting classes at UTI.

Process and Rules: This grant program is available starting January 30, 2026, through September 30, 2026. Students must complete an application and essay and submit them both to the UTI Scholarships & Grants Department. For all applicants, the final deadline for receipt of this application is the day before their scheduled start date. Based on application volume, a minimum of six (6) grants will be awarded monthly on a first come, first served basis. All eligible applications will be reviewed by the UTI Scholarships & Grants Committee, and all applicants will be notified of grant outcome within 48 hours of application submission. **This grant is ONLY available to incoming students who are enrolled to attend Universal Technical Institute. Students already attending classes are ineligible to apply.**

Students must be enrolled to attend Universal Technical Institute at the time of application submission. Grants awarded are not transferable to any other person. Only one (1) award of this grant will be given per student. This grant is considered an internal tuition reduction and has no cash value. All internal tuition reductions are pro-rated over the time a student is in school. If a student chooses not to attend UTI prior to the deadline or, after beginning their program chooses to leave for any reason (withdrawal, suspended, terminated), they will forfeit any unused portion of the award. All grants awarded through this program can only be used during the initial enrollment; any unutilized funds cannot be applied to a secondary account/enrollment.
