

She medaled in the qualifier, finishing two strokes better than her competitors, and secured her spot at the 78th U.S. Women's Open. We appreciate the hard work and dedication of our volunteers who show up to make this event possible and keep the operations for the Bobcat Open running smoothly, making it such a fun event for our golfers. We want to take the time to recognize a faithful volunteer who continues to show up year after year and encourages others to join him. This year, it is our privilege to announce the 2023 Bobcat Open's Volunteer of the Year Award recipient, Rob Waletzko.

Rob got involved with the Bobcat ND Open about 14 years ago with two friends from the Gwinner Bobcat plant. They historically take the morning shift, leaving Lisbon, North Dakota, at about 6 o'clock in the morning to get to the Fargo Country Club to start their duties. You can typically find him volunteering at the "lowly job of ball spotter," as he calls it, but says that it's a more complex job than it sounds, especially since he's usually covering holes by the river.

"Get out and just give it a try," Rob said of volunteering at the Bobcat Open. "It might be intimidating because it's golf, and it can be an intimidating sport, but it's an opportunity to network with fellow Bobcat employees that you don't typically get to see, and it helps build a great workplace culture."

Rob's volunteering goes beyond the Bobcat Open, as he volunteers for the local fire department, city council, and parish council at his church and helps with an adaptive program for handicapped kids. He cites his mom as being his inspiration for getting involved in the community. "I think sometimes people have the perception that community is something that's provided for them," Rob said. "I think really, it's on the people of the community to really make the community what they want it to be."

Volunteering can be mundane work like Rob's "lowly job of ball spotter," or it can be hard physical work. But when you take the time to put in the effort, like Rob, our community is better because of it. The Bobcat Open is a fundraiser for The Village Family Services, which strives to meet the community's needs and enhance overall well-being with innovative service and integrated care models. That includes counseling for mental health, in-home family therapy, addiction treatment, mentoring, debt management, adoption and pregnancy options counseling.
