


Visual Guide Easy Read

What is included?



My Brother's a Genius is a live theatre performance written and created by Debris Stevenson and directed by Eleanor Manners.




The performance will last **approximately 1 hour**

This means there will be audience on 3 sides of the stage


About the show

Content information:



- slurs and stereotypes about disability

- flashing lights


Access performances

- a chill out space is available




Captioned performance

The performance will be captioned in English on a screen



Sensory Adapted Performance


Friday 20 March 2pm

- You can make noise and move




At the venue
