Dr. Huang and Family Donate \$100,000 for ACMC Women's Imaging

Dr. Shin E Huang and his family recently presented the ACMC Foundation with a \$100,000



donation to help advance women's healthcare in Ashtabula County. Dr. Huang, an obstetrician-gynecologist who delivered more than 5,000 babies through his career in Ashtabula, joined the ACMC Medical Staff in 1972, providing care for women and families until his retirement in 2014. Dr. Huang said supporting local healthcare has always been a priority and donating to women's healthcare at ACMC is a blessing for him and his family.

The donation supports an imaging suite at ACMC dedicated to women's healthcare. The suite will consolidate several of ACMC's existing imaging services into an area devoted to the unique needs of women. The suite will offer mammography, ultrasound, and bone density scan all within a defined space designed for comfort as well as quality healthcare services. The project features new finishes, fixture upgrades, and new state-of-the-art equipment.
