**BACKGROUND** and **PURPOSE**: Ambulation is important for patient treatment and recovery. To further reduce the risk of spread of COVID-19 among our workforce and patients, the following guidelines are provided for patients ambulating outside of their assigned rooms.

## POLICY/PROTOCOL:

During our COVID-19 response, ambulation should be limited to therapeutic activity and not recreational (e.g., boredom, etc.).

Patients will be allowed to ambulate if the following conditions are met:

- 1. The patient's activity order permits ambulation.
- 2. The patient wears a properly fitted face-covering or mask.
- 3. The patient uses the proper handwashing technique before donning and doffing the face-covering/mask.
- 4. The patient uses the proper handwashing technique before leaving the room and upon return.
- 5. Social distancing is maintained.
- 6. The patient remains in the unit of admission.

Pediatric patients may also ambulate or be pulled in a wagon if they meet the above criteria. Diversional activities should be provided in the child's room when possible.
