Disposable Eye Protection	Clean with hospital grade disinfectant	No	Single	Assign to single user, store for reuse			
Reusable Mask	In house launder (Remove filter first)	Yes	Extended Use (unless soiled, wet or damaged)	Purple/pink linen bin			
N95 Mask	Sterilization	No	Extended use (unless soiled, wet or damaged)	Dirty PAPR/N95 Bin			
P95/P100	Sanitization	Yes	Clean after each useExtend use for single user during shift	Dirty PAPR/N95 Bin			
PAPR hood 3M	Clean after doffing with hospital grade disinfectant, sterilize prior to another user	Yes, after sterilization	Clean after each useExtend use for single user during shift	Dirty PAPR/N95 Bin			
PAPR hood Simms/Camo	Clean after doffing with hospital grade disinfectant wipe	No	Clean after each use	Assign to single user, store for reuse			
PAPR device	Clean with hospital grade disinfectant	Yes, after disinfection	Clean after each use	Return clean PAPR to donning station

Reusable patient equipment	Hospital grade disinfectant, clean prior to use on another patient	Clean per normal protocols	Use dedicated equipment if possible for patient or a cohort of patients	Gloves			
Inpatient rooms	Hospital grade disinfectant	 Clean per normal protocols Terminally clean per EVS protocol plus UV light 	Clean high touch surfaces 2x daily	 Gown & gloves Eye protection and mask if splashes or sprays anticipated Use PAPR or N95 for specified timeframe if after aerosol generating procedure 			
Procedural or ambulatory rooms and surfaces	Hospital grade disinfectant	Clean per normal protocols	Use UV light if available				
Linen, dietary and waste	Management of laundry, food service utensils, and medical waste should also be performed in accordance with routine procedures.
