What is Occupational Therapy?

Occupational Therapy is a healthcare service. Practitioners use productive and creative activity to treat and rehabilitate physically and emotionally disabled people.

At Cape Regional Medical Center, our focus is to assist in the patient's return to a functional, independent lifestyle after they have been compromised by injury, illness, or the aging process. Helping a patient regain needs like dressing, bathing, working, driving, and social responsibilites, is the goal of the Occupational Therapist.

Types of Programs

"Inpatient" Occupational Therapy restores a patient's functional independence. Using standardized assessments, we evaluate the patient's ability to complete self-care, level of safety, and explore the possibility of adaptive equipment needs for the home.

"Outpatient" Occupational Therapy addresses the needs of the upper extremities as they directly impact a patient's ability to function. We assess range of motion, strength, dexterity, and coordination as they ultimately affect the patient's ability to function.

Customized, individual treatment programs are developed for each patient to improve areas in need that were addressed in the evaluation process.

How to Refer

A physician referral is required for inpatient and outpatient treatment.
