New Wind Sculpture Honors the Late Dr. Marvin C. Cohen

Retired general surgeon Marvin C. Cohen, MD, died Aug. 11, 2016. His friends, family and coworkers came together to purchase a Lyman Whitaker wind sculpture, titled "Double Helix Sail," in his memory. To commemorate its placement in the rose garden at the front entrance of Cass Regional, a dedication ceremony was held on Tuesday, Dec. 6.

Foundation board member and hospital chaplain Fred Kidd led the attendees in a prayer, and then each person placed a white tulip bulb to be planted at the base of the sculpture. Inside, the conference room was decorated with photos from Dr. Cohen's life and a few pieces of his most beloved memorabilia. After a short program, guests enjoyed Dr. Cohen's favorite refreshments, including Coca-Cola and M&M's.

\$8,500 in Scholarships Awarded in 2016

Through the generosity of donors just like you, six local students have received scholarships to help them achieve their career goals in health care. The Foundation would like to thank all of the scholarship donors and congratulate the recipients of these prestigious awards.

Alma Brown Scholarship

The Alma Brown Scholarship was established in 2013 with a bequest from Alma Brown of Harrisonville. This \$1,000 scholarship is offered once a year and was awarded to Jodi Rhodes of Cleveland, Mo. Jodi is attending Missouri Western State University to pursue a career in nursing.

Wanda Brown Scholarship

The Wanda Brown Scholarship was established in 1999 with a gift from Wanda A. Brown. This \$1,000 annual scholarship was awarded to Kelsey Cumpton of Garden City, Mo. Kelsey is attending the University of Central Missouri to pursue a bachelor's degree in nursing.

Elvin S. Douglas, Jr., Scholarship

The Elvin S. Douglas, Jr., Scholarship was established by friends and colleagues to honor Mr. Douglas' 25 years of service to the hospital board. This \$500* scholarship is offered once a year and was awarded to Kimberly Potter of Harrisonville, Mo. Kimberly is attending Northwest Missouri State University to pursue a bachelor's degree in clinical laboratory science.

Geraldine Kidd Scholarship

The Geraldine Kidd Scholarship was established by colleagues, family and friends in memory of "Gerri" Kidd, who was an LPN for over 20 years at Cass Regional. This \$500* scholarship is offered once a year and was awarded to Kelsey Cumpton, who also received the Wanda Brown Scholarship.

Franceline Parris Scholarship

The Franceline Parris Scholarship was established in 2005 by Franceline Parris, a Harrisonville resident and member of the Cass Regional Auxiliary. This \$1,000 scholarship was awarded to Vera Stanley of Pleasant Hill, Mo. Vera is attending Missouri Western State University to pursue a bachelor's degree in nursing.

Jan Perry Scholarship

The Jan Perry Scholarship was established in 2002 by Jan Perry, who was a member of the Cass Regional Auxiliary, and her husband, Wirt. This \$1,500 scholarship is awarded twice a year, but three disbursements were made in 2016.

One disbursement was made to Amber Zuber of Raymore, Mo., who applied for the scholarship in the fall of 2015. Amber is attending Park University to pursue an associate's degree in nursing. The first Perry Scholarship offered in 2016 was awarded to Jodi Rhodes, who also received the Alma Brown Scholarship.

The second Perry Scholarship of 2016 was awarded to Jamie Spence of Raymore, Mo. Jamie is attending the University of Kansas School of Nursing to pursue a bachelor's degree in nursing.

*The scholarship amount varies from year to year and is dependent upon the investment earnings available.
