Prairie Restoration Project Planned for Trail

In early September, members of the foundation's board of directors met with Andy Carmack, a private land conservationist with the Missouri Department of Conservation, to discuss possible projects at The Floyd and Franceline Parris Community Trail. The group toured the trail and Carmack pointed out some of the invasive species that were prolifically growing in the area, including ragweed, sericea, and poison ivy. Woody encroachment (primarily pear and ash) was also noted as a concern.

After the tour, Carmack proposed that the foundation undertake a prairie restoration project on the entire site, and the foundation board's Executive Committee has approved the project. Work will begin over the winter months with the removal of smaller encroaching trees and brush-hogging of the area to be restored. Next growing season, a herbicide will be used over the area to eradicate invasive plants, which will result in an unattractive landscape for several months. In late fall 2022, native wildflower and grass seeds will be plugged into the soil, resulting in beautiful blooms throughout the 2023 growing season and beyond. A wide variety of wildflowers will be selected to ensure season-long color and to provide food sources for insects such as the monarch butterfly. Grasses will take up to three years to establish. Once the prairie is established, it will be burned every three years to control invasive plants and reinvigorate the grasses.

Atherton Awarded Jan Perry Scholarship



Colleen Atherton, LPN, has been named the recipient of the 2021 Jan Perry Scholarship for Cass Regional Medical Center employees. She will receive a \$2,000 award, which will be paid to her educational institution on her behalf.

Atherton lives in Pleasant Hill and has worked in the Medical Imaging department at Cass Regional since 2019. She is pursuing an associate's degree in nursing at North Central Community College.

The scholarship program was established at Cass Regional Medical Center Foundation in 2002 by the late Jan Perry of Harrisonville. Jan, who was member of the Cass Regional Auxiliary, was motivated by the gratitude she felt for the nurses who cared for her throughout her battle with cancer. She initially funded the scholarship by putting back a little of her grocery money each week until she had saved \$1,000. After her death in 2007, her husband, Wirt, made a donation to expand Jan's

scholarship program to two \$2,000 annual scholarships. Selection for the award is based on financial need and career goals.

Create a Lasting Legacy

Some of our scholarship programs have been established through a "planned gift." Planned gifts refer to donations that are made from a donor's accumulated assets and are part of the donor's overall estate plan. In most cases, these gifts come in the form of simple bequests provided for in the donor's will (such as a set amount of money or a percentage of the estate). Some donors will choose to notify us of their plans in advance, so that they can convey their wishes and discuss gift options, while others keep their plans confidential until after their death.

Below is sample language that you can use when including Cass Regional Medical Center Foundation in your will.

"I give, devise and bequeath [written amount or a percentage of the estate or described property] to Cass Regional Medical Center Foundation of Harrisonville, Missouri, to be used by the Foundation for the benefit of Cass Regional Medical Center. It is my desire that these funds be used for [specific purpose]; however, the use of such funds shall be entirely within the discretion of the board of directors of the Foundation."
