It has always been a dream of mine to help serve on the Board of Directors when I retired, and I am blessed that it is happening before that time." Mary Jean also serves as a member of the American Organization for Nursing Leadership (AONL), the Illinois Organization of Nurse Leaders (IONL), and the Association for Nursing Professional Development (ANPD); is on the leadership team and Treasurer for the Northern Illinois Pain Resource Nurse Consortium; and holds a Medical-Surgical Certification from the American Nurses Credentialing Center (ANCC).

In her free time, Mary Jean serves on the Board of Home of Hope, is a member of Harvest Time Bible Church, volunteers for the United Way's Let's Feed Our Children program, and loves to read, camp and travel. Married to her husband, Rich, for 22 years, they also enjoy spending time with their family and seven grandchildren.

"I feel that my years of experience will bring knowledge and value to the Board of Directors," said Derreberry. "It is just one way I can give back to CGH for all they have done in caring for me as an employee. We provide amazing service to members of our community, and I pray we can continue to provide this service, even with the healthcare challenges we face now and into the future."


Shop the Gift Shop Online
