CGH Launches Virtual Care - 24/7/365 Access to Healthcare

On February 20 CGH launched Virtual Care, a virtual clinic that offers 24/7/365 access to healthcare.

CGH Virtual Care provides patients with an exceptional care experience wherever they are and at any time using a computer, tablet, smartphone, or other telephone.



For \$35 per visit, patients can receive virtual urgent care services, including

diagnoses, prescriptions, and scheduling of follow-up appointments at any of CGH Medical Center's 16 area clinics.

"At CGH, we believe that seeing your regular doctor, nurse practitioner, or physician assistant is very important for your continuity of care," said Shane Brown, VP of Physician Services. "However, we know there are times when you may need an appointment that doesn't fit your schedule or when clinic offices or Ready Care are closed. Having an option for 24/7/365 access to care for minor illnesses through a virtual visit is an option CGH is now happy to make available to everyone in our communities and service area."

CGH Virtual Care is built on clinical and technology partner Carena's Virtual Clinic Platform, and uses Carena's group of certified and contracted physicians, nurse practitioners, and physician assistants. The clinicians working in the virtual clinic will follow best practice guidelines to ensure that CGH patients receive high quality, evidence-based care.

Your leaders are currently giving you supportive education on what that exchange of empathy looks like in your departments. As we work through this leg of the Culture of Caring Journey, several thoughts help keep us on track.

1.) Listen to Understand, Not to Respond. Listen to the other person before forming your opinion or response. Slow down and just hear what they are telling you.

"Sometimes all a person wants is an empathetic ear; all he or she needs is to talk it out. Just offering a listening ear and an understanding heart for his or her suffering can be a big comfort."

2.) If you don't know what to say to someone who is hurting, just let them know you are there and listening. You don't need a script or a perfect response. Just stay engaged and listen to their emotions. Acknowledge their suffering by giving them your full attention.

3.) You choose to either criticize or empathize. It is impossible to both at the same time. Criticizing requires narrowed, negative thinking and is counterproductive. Empathizing lends itself to a more positive environment. Empathy is not just a skill, but also a choice.

"Self-absorption in all its forms kills empathy, let alone compassion. When we focus on ourselves, our world contracts as our problems and preoccupations loom large. But when we focus on others, our world expands. Our own problems drift to the periphery of the mind and so seem smaller, and we increase our capacity for connection - or compassionate action."

4.) Assume positive intentions. People don't come to work with the singular goal of making your day difficult. They may make it difficult because of obstacles that they are facing, but that was not #1 on their to-do list of their day. Once you assume positive intentions and get that roadblock out of your head, you can empathize.

CGH Tampico Introduces Toni Ikens, APN, FNP-BC





In the event of a child/infant respiratory or cardiac arrest in the hospital or main clinic:

- ✓ Dial 5511, ask switchboard to page Code PALS and give location
- ✓ Switchboard operator announces Code PALS and location
- ✓ Initial responders bring Pediatric Crash Cart to room/area
- Code Blue team responds
