CGH Auxiliary Donates Binder Lift™ Vests to **Local EMS Departments**

Back injuries are the leading cause for early retirement within emergency medical services personnel. According to a study, EMS personnel have a lifting related injury rate of 21.3 times higher than the national average. In response, CGH Medical Center Auxiliary recently donated eight Binder Lift™ vests to equip CGH EMS and Sterling and Rock Falls Fire Departments with an easier and safer alternative for patient handling.

"The intent of the Binder Lift vests is to provide multiple lifting points for people that are down in awkward spots, while making the patient feel more safe and secure," said


Leukemia, Lymphoma, and **Multiple Myeloma**Networking Group

CGH Health Foundation Employee Scholarship Deadline April 28

Deadline for the \$3,000 Blue Sky Healthcare Education Scholarship, sponsored by the CGH Health Foundation, is Friday, April 28 at 5 p.m.

The grant was created in 2011 by a local family to benefit CGH Medical Center employees and their children. One scholarship is given out each year and it is renewable. Full- and part-time students may apply. Past recipients include Lindsay Long, Kandice Denning, Beriah Foust, Tiffany Cantu, Brennah Zuidema and Nichole Mitchem.

Students must show proof of acceptance in an accredited healthcare program such as x-ray tech, physical therapy, paramedic/EMT, nursing, respiratory therapy, laboratory technician, etc. Prerequisite classes should already be completed. Students accepted to either medical, pharmacy, nurse practitioner, physician assistant or pre-med programs are excluded from applying for this scholarship.

A brief profile of yourself emphasizing occupational goals (1 page or less) and one letter of recommendation are required. Applicants must prepare a short essay answering both of the following questions: (1) Why are you interested in seeking/building a career in your chosen area of healthcare? and (2) How will receiving this scholarship help you?
