CGH Receives LEAP Award for Outstanding Performance in Finance and Strategy

CGH Medical Center recently received the 2017 LEAP (Lead, Excel, Achieve, Progress) Award from Strata Decision Technology at Lift, the annual Strata Decision Technology (Strata) Summit for healthcare planning and performance in Chicago.



The LEAP award recognizes healthcare organizations for outstanding performance in the

areas of finance and strategy to benefit both their organization and the community that they serve. The award honors exceptional healthcare organizations that have used StrataJazz® to solve real world problems related to financial analytics, business intelligence and decision support. CGH Medical Center and Aurora Healthcare were selected as recipients of the 2017 LEAP award.

In response to a desire to improve our existing financial reporting processes, the Accounting department implemented a dynamic planning approach, often referred to as "beyond budgeting". They leveraged StrataJazz to support this transition and were able to reduce the amount of time they spend on budgeting by close to 50%.

CGH also used StrataJazz for Decision Support to help attain a Volume Decrease Adjustment (VDA) of approximately \$950,000 for the Centers for Medicare and Medicaid (CMS). A VDA is a payment adjustment granted by CMS to Medicare dependent hospitals such as CGH when these providers experience a decline in discharges greater than 5% in any given year due to an unusual circumstance or occurrence that is externally imposed and beyond the hospital's control. Qualifying for a VDA requires the analytical capabilities to determine the proper reimbursement amount and StrataJazz was used to aid in the process of determining the root cause of the decline.

Disaster Drill • October 18

CGH Medical Center will be participating with area Whiteside County Agencies in an Emergency Preparedness exercise on Wed., October 18. Other participants include the Whiteside



County Emergency Management Agency, Whiteside County Community Health Center, and 22 area Long Term Care (LTC) Facilities.

The scenario will be a chlorine release which will force evacuation of many of the LTC facilities. Manikins and "paper patients" will arrive at CGH for decontamination and treatment. The exercise will begin at approximately 11:30 a.m. and will continue for a couple of hours. CGH will set up the new Zumro tent for decontamination in the west ambulance bay, and will set up the Minimum Treatment Area. Observers are welcome to watch the tent setup and decontamination process.
