Early Heart Attack Care and Chest Pain Center Accreditation

Early Heart Attack Care (EHAC) is knowing the subtle danger signs and symptoms and acting upon them before damage occurs. Heart attacks might be prevented by listening to your heart and seeking help promptly.

Recently CGH Medical Center has been training staff and working with community members on EHAC. Educational presentations have been provided during community group meetings. Presentations address risk factors, smoking



cessation, heart-healthy nutrition, typical and atypical symptoms of heart attack, and how symptoms sometimes differ for men vs. women.

"Community education also focuses upon how to recognize early warning signs and promptly intervene, namely the importance of calling 9-1-1 and knowing how to provide hands-only CPR," said Val Sigafus, CGH Program Director, Nursing Professional Practice and Education. "CGH staff have also received training on these topics, and for nurses who care for patients with chest pain in ED and inpatient/OBS areas, specialized education has been provided regarding Acute Coronary Syndrome symptom recognition and emergent intervention."

On a similar note, CGH is also currently pursuing Chest Pain Center (CPC) Accreditation, an American College of Cardiology quality improvement program designed for hospital cardiovascular teams that are focused on the efficient and effective care of acute coronary syndrome (ACS) patients.

CPC Accreditation drives an organization to establish consistent, high-quality processes across the continuum of care, furnishing a roadmap for progress and highly-valued, sustainable performance improvement. CPC Accreditation helps:

- Reduce variations of care
- Lower length of stay (LOS)
- Sustain consistent process improvement
- Decrease readmissions
- Maximize reimbursements

"The primary reason for pursuing accreditation is to provide excellent cardiac care to patients in our region, making sure they are provided with education, prevention and treatment that is evidence-based and efficient," said Sigafus.

The accreditation application process includes a multitude of requirements, including submission of policies, flowcharts, meeting minutes, educational presentation objectives and attendance, risk stratification documentation, quality improvement plans, and demonstration of collaboration between all facets of the care continuum. The process is approximately a year long, followed by a site survey and ongoing patient data submission to ensure that CGH is following best practice. We anticipate CGH will have an on-site surveyor early in 2018.
