CGH has begun a partnership with National Research (NRC Health) with access to National Research Transparency solutions. We will use existing patient experience survey data to publish independently verified ratings and reviews on our own website and physician profile pages, coming soon.

Dr. Keith Martin, CMO, talked about the vital expansion of this partnership to grow the organization and improve the patient experience.



## **Mohs Surgery**



Can anyone tell me what is going on over at the Main Clinic? Is there some kind of Zombie Apocalypse? Did Kmart have a blue light special on gauze pads? (For starters, who actually remembers blue light specials at Kmart?) NO, it's just another typical Mohs surgery day in the Dermatology department, and those walking wounded you see roaming the halls aren't zombies or Kmart frequent flyers, they are patients of Dr. Stees and his fine staff. Together, they are on a crusade to rid the Sauk Valley and surrounding communities of basal and squamous cell carcinomas! They have even been known to go after some specific melanomas from time to time.

What is Mohs surgery? The Mohs procedure involves surgically removing skin cancer layer by layer and examining the tissue under a microscope until healthy, cancer-free tissue around the tumor is reached (called clear margins). Mohs surgery is the most effective treatment for most types of skin cancer and removes the least amount of normal, healthy tissue. Last month, IDPH did their inital CLIA inspection, of the Mohs laboratory, and they had an excellent inspection, so next time you see Dr. Stees or his staff tell them congratulations!
