CGH Introduces the Latest in MRI Technology

CGH Medical Center has acquired the latest in MRI technology by installing the new Vantage Titan ™ from Canon Medical Systems. The new open-bore of the 1.5T Vantage Titan MR system is 18 percent larger than other 1.5T systems on the market and features a large 71-centimeter patient aperture, outstanding homogeneity, and the largest available clinical field-of-view (FOV) of 55 x 55 x 50 centimeters, providing the highest level of patient care and diagnostic capability in MR imaging.

"We are really excited about being able to offer our community this state of the art equipment, " said Gina Grennan, Director of Diagnostic Imaging.

"This particular scanner offers

excellent quality and image resolution, while offering a wider bore opening for patient entry and a noise reduction technology to make the exam more comfortable and to reduce anxiety."

The Vantage Titan's patient-focused features significantly improve patient comfort and increase the range of patients who can be imaged with MR. The open bore provides a greater feeling of openness for the patient, and Canon Medical Systems' patented Pianissimo technology dramatically reduces acoustic noise, the most significant cause of patient discomfort during an MRI exam.

- Cognitive Communication Impairments: Underlying attention, memory, abstract reasoning or problem-solving deficits characterize these issues, which are possibly related to stroke, brain injury, or underlying disease.
- Dysarthria: This form of speech is slurred or slow, and it can be caused by neurological injuries such as stroke.
- Vocal Quality Concerns: People with these issues have vocal tones that are too loud or too soft, and those issues are commonly caused by vocal abuse or cancer. CGH is proud to offer Lee Silverman Voice Treatment (LSVT) LOUD certified speech therapy services for patient struggling with Parkinson's Disease and other neurological conditions.
- Swallowing Difficulty (Dysphagia): The nerves and • muscles that impact your ability to speak clearly may also play a role in your ability to manipulate food and swallow it without choking. Our therapists can assist people who have these chewing and swallowing disorders.
