We are the only hospital in the Sauk Valley area, as well as within our 50-mile service area, to earn that top 'A' score," said Dr. Paul Steinke, President and CEO. "Our staff takes great personal pride in this recognition. Their efforts make CGH such a progressive facility"

"This is the only national rating of how well hospitals protect patients from preventable harm and death, such as medical errors, infections, and injuries," said Leah Binder, President and CEO of The Leapfrog Group. "Receiving an 'A' Safety Grade means a hospital is among the best in the country for preventing these terrible problems and putting their patients first, 24 hours a day."

Developed under the guidance of an Expert Panel, the Leapfrog Hospital Safety Grade uses 27 measures of publicly available hospital safety data to assign grades to approximately 2,500 U.S. hospitals twice per year. It is peer reviewed, fully transparent and free to the public.

After 18 months of intense dedication from the CGH Revenue Cycle team and from our business partner in this journey, S&P Consulting, the Cerner Revenue Cycle computer system went live on May 1! The team did not miss a key date during the project, and was also able to send claims to insurance companies and statements to patients within the first week, which is unprecedented.

The project started May 2017. This project was extremely difficult. It involved Patient Accounts, HID, and Patient Access. The project also received support from our clinical and IT areas. While we partnered with S&P Consultants, all of the project was done in house.

The new Cerner Patient Accounting system went live on May 1, 2018. CGH may be the only Cerner client who has gone live with Cerner Revenue Cycle on the original targeted go-live date without pushing go-live.

"A huge thank you to the CGH team and to the S&P team that committed so much of their time away from family to ensure the success of this project!" said Ken Koerner, Director, Revenue Cycle. "There will continue to be challenges that present in the months ahead, but I am confident that our team will be able to resolve anything that presents."
