CGH Hosts Summer Nursing Students from SVCC

About two years ago, nurses managers identified a need to actively respond to the national shortage of nurses while helping nursing students to integrate their newly-acquired assessment skills into a nurse's typical day. The Nursing Strategic Plan related to 'recruitment and retention of nurses' set a strategy to develop a curriculum that was eventually presented and approved by SVCC as a summer elective called "Integration to Nursing Practice." This elective provides an avenue to help the student transition to "real world" nursing workflow. Our CGH nursing staff, led by Val Sigafus as the Clinical Instructor, kicked off the program last summer with one student. It was so well received that the program was offered again this summer.

This year, seven students, between years one and two of nursing school, participated in the 8-week course, spending partial shifts with preceptors on 2E, 3E, OBS and CCU. During their clinicals, students were able to work side-by-side with experienced nurses, witnessing how to best prioritize aspects of care, learn critical thinking skills, passing medications, and practicing nursing skills such as starting IVs and Foley catheters. Students were also allowed to shadow in a variety of roles to help them see various departments and disciplines to gain a greater understanding of the many components required to make patient care possible. Students shadowed in OR and Am Surg, Cath Lab and Cardiolab, Diagnostic Imaging, Peds, OB, DHC, at the Main Clinic, with Shift Coordinators, and in several other areas.

Post-clinical discussions included review of clinical opportunities or challenges they encountered, as well as topics addressing patient-centered care, teamwork and collaboration, and other aspects of nursing professional growth. The course also provided an opportunity to identify and discuss an evidence-based practice project they could potentially use as their Capstone project during their senior year.

Clinical instructor, Val Sigafus, and the students would like to express appreciation to all of the departmental Directors, preceptors, and shadowing sites for accommodating the students and providing them with this excellent experience.
