Catalyzing Change: Health Information Technology Week

National Health IT (NHIT) Week is a nationwide awareness week focused on the value of health IT. NHIT Week demonstrates the value of health IT in supporting healthcare transformation, expanding access to high quality care, increasing economic opportunity, and making communities healthier. Although NHIT Week is officially October 8-12, we have chosen to celebrate at CGH Monday, October 15 through Friday, October 19.

"At CGH our IT department supports various facets of healthcare transformation and access to high quality care. We currently have projects underway to improve quality reporting and interoperability," said Kevin



Anderson, Director, Information Technology. "In addition, we have successfully provided telehealth with eICU, TeleStroke and TelePsychiatry for several years."

We have 21 full time and 2 part time employees in the Information Technology department and 7 full time and 1 part time employee in the Health Informatics department. We are two separate departments with IT focusing on our computer infrastructure and several of the smaller applications. Health Informatics' focus is on Cerner and supporting how that applications is built and used.

While the Health Informatics and Information Technology departments will have activities internally all next week, October 17 will be the day that we focus on sharing what Health IT is all about to the rest of CGH. This will include a short email to all users reminding them of Health IT week and a display at the cafeteria entrance during the lunch hour. Health Informatics and IT will also be sponsoring some games for all employees on October 18.

The IT department has also put together a FAQ that might help all users understand how to use their computers and how to get help. 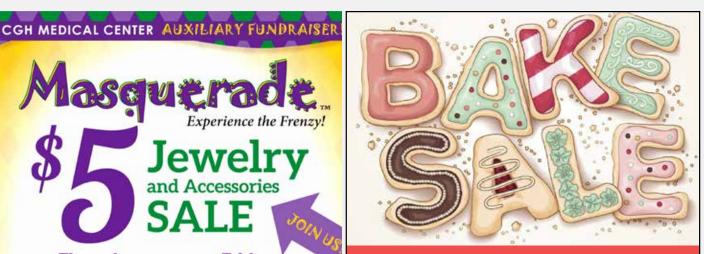
