### CGH Celebrates the Career of Dr. Mark Styczynski

"He has been an awesome doctor!" "I have trusted him with my healthcare needs for 30 years, and I wish I could be his patient for 30 more."

These were just a few of the sentiments shared at the Open House on Thursday, January 3 that celebrated the career of Dr. Mark Styczynski. Dr. Styczynski has practiced Internal Medicine at CGH for over 38 years and recently announced his retirement.

"I wanted to be a doctor ever since the 8th grade after I read the book <u>Arrowsmith</u> by Sinclair Lewis," he said. "I admired how this doctor was dedicated to serving others, yet often challenged the existing state of things when he found it lacked either a proper scientific basis or intellectual honesty. The theme dovetailed with my keen interest in science and enjoyment in working with people."



Dr. Mark Styczynski and his wife, Ann, welcomed approximately 200 guests at the retirement open house.

Since that time, Dr. Styczynski said he enjoyed developing connections with many diverse people and their lives. "I would observe each patient's different challenges and how they dealt with them, and I hoped to be able to help them out in one small way or another," he said. "The close relationships with my patients, and their show of appreciation for my efforts to help were exciting to me."

His patients agreed. "Dr. Stitch is a good listener, is very friendly, and he tries to solve the problem," said one patient. "He was always good at identifying what the situation was and tried to attack it by taking some sort of action." "He's a great doctor and a better person," remarked another patient. "When Dr. Styczynski retires, CGH will lose an experienced, knowledgeable, and caring physician."

Dr. Styczynski also remarked that he found it most gratifying to observe and comfort his many long-term patients that were experiencing the health challenges typical of growing older while learning to adjust and accept the last phases of life. "Sharing this experience with them - coming to realize that they had led a full life, preparing for its end, and helping them to

be okay with the future – that was a highlight of my career."

In retirement, Dr. Styczynski plans on traveling, spending time with his parents, and visiting his children, as well as continuing to sing in a local barbershop quartet and taking dance lessons with his wife, Ann.

Good luck in all of your future endeavors, Dr. Stitch...you will be greatly missed!


clothing. Yoga is traditionally performed in bare feet.
