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#### CGH Recognizes DAISY Award Winner Melissa Cassens, RN

On Friday, January 25, Melissa Cassens, a registered nurse in the CGH Birthing Center, was recognized in front of a large group of friends, family and co-workers, as a recipient of the prestigious DAISY Award for extraordinary nurses. An international program, the award is presented to nurses around the world who go above and beyond for their patients and demonstrate extraordinary compassionate care.

"Despite this being my second pregnancy and child, Melissa treated it as though it was my first," said the patient's nomination for Cassens. "She made sure to complete thorough education with myself and my significant other...and provided a comfortable setting to ask questions without feeling as if I should have known the answers since this was my second child. She helped provide one-on-one care for breastfeeding and shared tips that she had from being a mother herself."

"At one point during her shift," the patient continued, "she knew they were going to get busy with admissions for laboring mothers, so Melissa took the time to come in and check on me and introduce me to the CNA who would listen for my call light...I knew the department was busy, but you would not have known it, as Melissa always had a smile on her face and was very caring...Melissa is compassionate about her job and the care she provides, and it shows with her actions to her patients and their family."

The DAISY Award - an acronym for "Diseases Attacking the Immune System" - was established by the DAISY Foundation in California in memory of J. Patrick Barnes, who died at age 33 of an autoimmune disease. During his hospitalization, they deeply appreciated the care and compassion shown to Patrick and his entire family. When he died, they felt compelled to say "thank you" to nurses in a very public way. The DAISY Award continues to recognize and celebrate the outstanding professionalism and compassion that nurses bring to patients and their families every day.

CGH Medical Center is proud to announce that renovations have been completed on the 2 East Surgical Floor located within the hospital. A public and staff open house to celebrate its completion will be held on Wednesday, February 20 from 3 to 6 p.m.

"We began this renovation project in September 2017 to improve our level of care and provide greater comfort to our patients," said Plant Operations Manager, Bob Lehman. "A majority of the construction

was completed by our in-house maintenance staff, and we are very proud of the enhanced

space and the benefits it will provide for years to come."

The 15,430 square foot renovation features the addition of one bariatric patient room, an isolation/negative pressure room, and two safe rooms, as well as the following improvements to all 20 rooms: paint, vinyl flooring, LED lighting, a new air handling unit, a new heating system, and new variable air volume boxes that will provide each patient a higher level of temperature control in his/her individual room. In addition, all patient bathrooms and shower areas in each room were increased in size and include upgrades of the lighting, ceramic tile, and plumbing fixtures.

"We strive to make each visit the best possible visit for our patients and their loved ones, so we continued to place a strong emphasis on patient-focused care during this project," said Julie Morse, Surgical Floor Director. "The renovations not only promote nurse safety and efficiency, but also improve the safety, comfort and healing environment for our patients." The theme of the January Health Nurse Healthy Nation challenge was "Pump up the Produce."

Participants were instructed to snap a selfie of yourself eating a salad. **Debbie Beveroth** (CGH Birthing Center) was the winner of a \$50 gift certificate for the Twin City Farmer's Market for her submission.


"Salad is a daily staple for me so sending a picture of me eating one wasn't a hardship," remarked Debbie. "I have also lost 5 lbs so I have been really
