# CGH Birthing Center Enhances Newborn Security with Digital Footprints

Newborns at CGH are making their mark on the world one step at a time, but it's no longer just a keepsake. The CGH Birthing Center recently installed a new and innovative Infant Safety System, developed by CertaScan Technologies (www.certascantek.com), that helps ensure baby's safety from day one. The proprietary system allows the hospital to capture digital, high resolution newborn footprints which can be used for precise identification in emergency situations throughout the child's life, like abduction, lost baby or natural disaster.



"The system is entirely safe for use on babies and provides outstanding digital footprint quality," said Kathy Milby, CGH Director of Maternal-Child Services. "Ink and paper images often smudge because babies are always moving. Now we are able to capture a digital image of a baby's footprint which is stored in the newborn's electronic medical record and is linked to a picture of the baby and the mother's fingerprint."



The Newborn Safety System — which uses LiveScan Technology — has received attention and praise from the National Center for Missing and Exploited Children (NCMEC) and has been included as a recommendation for hospitals in its most recent Infant Security Guidelines.

"Much like fingerprints, footprints are unique to each baby, so they can be used for identification that will reinforce the baby's safety for a lifetime," added Dr. Paul Steinke, CGH President and CEO.

The CGH Birthing Center gives parents a complimentary birth certificate with their newborn's footprints, and families will have access online at www.firstfootprint.com to enhance the footprint certificate with colors, different fonts and borders after they go home. Parents can also download a digital copy of their baby's footprints to create other keepsakes as well.

"The CertaScan is another example of how CGH continuously raises the standard of care for our patients," continued Dr. Steinke, "and we're proud to offer this latest technology in newborn security."

## **Temporary Visitor Restrictions**



Due to a rise in widespread influenza activity, not only in the community, but also in patients visiting our Emergency Department and outpatient clinics, CGH Medical Center is implementing temporary visitor restrictions effective immediately. While we realize these temporary steps may result in some inconvenience to family members and other

visitors, the safety and well-being of our patients, visitors and staff is our highest priority.

#### Until further notice, visitor restrictions include:

- Visitors will be limited to 2 adults per patient at any time. Limiting the number of visitors per patient will help control the spread of the illness.
- Since children are more likely to get sick and spread influenza, siblings and children under the age of 18 will only be permitted to visit patients in special cases with prior approval from the patients' healthcare team.
- Patients coming to the CGH ED or outpatient clinics with influenza symptoms will be asked to wear a mask.
- Wash your hands frequently. Make sure you clean your hands when entering and leaving the patient's room by washing with soap and water or rubbing your hands together with hand sanitizer (located in every patient room).
- Do not visit the hospital if you have symptoms of the flu. Signs of the flu include fever, cough, sneezing, runny nose or sore throat. The flu is easily and most often spread as a result of coughs or sneezes. A sneeze from one person with the flu can spread up to 20,000 flu germs into the air.
- If you haven't already, get the flu vaccine. Getting the simple shot can help increase your chances of staying healthy and avoid getting others sick.

Together, we can prevent the spread of the flu in our hospital and our community this season. Thank you for your cooperation and support.
