## CGH Inpatient Pharmacy Employee Open House

includes a new workspace for CGH Home Nursing/ Infusion, a medication receiving room, a negative pressure hazardous drug room, two negative pressure clean rooms, a 24 hour use hood, a medication compounding area, storage, breakroom, and office space/workstations for CGH's ten pharmacists, ten technicians and the pharmacy buyer.

The space also includes a fully automated medication carousel that holds 65-70% of CGH's medications and communicates with the Pyxis machines throughout the hospital. To streamline the process of their Pyxis pulls, the carousel

program automatically rotates to the location of the proper medication and tells the pharmacists exactly how many need to be pulled. Medications, bin locations, etc. are all confirmed through a scanning device to ensure that no errors are made.

# Coronavirus Update



Infection Control would like to take a moment to provide some information about the novel Coronavirus as it is gaining a lot of attention in the media.

The novel Coronavirus causes respiratory illness and was first identified in China. It is spread by close person-to-person contact from droplets from a cough or sneeze. There are not many cases in the US, so the risk of contracting it in our community is **very low**. While the risk remains low, CGH has implemented measures to align with recommendations from the CDC and IDPH.

These measures include:

- Patients in both the hospital and our outpatient facilities are being screened for travel to China and for symptoms associated with the virus.
- Any patient who has traveled to China and has symptoms consistent with this new virus will be asked to wear a mask and will be taken to a private room for evaluation.
- Infection Control will be notified immediately by the staff and will make necessary recommendations.
- Signs are placed throughout our facilities asking patients to tell health care staff immediately if they have traveled and are experiencing respiratory symptoms.
- Departments are conducting inventory to ensure an adequate amount of PPE (personal protective equipment) is available.
- Infection Control Department has been and will continue to monitor the recommendations and provide revisions as needed.
