Are you are ready to work on your health and your weight in 2023? Please consider signing up for the CGH Health Transformation Program (HTP).

The Health Transformation Program (HTP) teaches participants how to lower blood pressure, control blood sugar, improve cholesterol numbers, and lose pounds and inches in the process. HTP is a one year commitment that includes classes every two weeks, individual counseling by a certified health coach, and quarterly lab work. The cost is only \$150.00 per year (\$6.00 per pay) but CGH employees get their money back at the end of every quarter as long as you attend class and complete the labs. I also oversee our Patient Advocate, assisting with patient complaints that rise to my level. I advise administration, staff and doctors with inquiries on how best to handle potential legal situations. I work with our liability insurance company to ensure our organization is compliant with reducing legal liability in areas that are deemed high-risk, based on recent claims and rulings throughout the state and country.
