A new day of behavioral health assistance for our OB moms who have suffered so greatly during the pandemic is being added to the free CGH Ways to Wellness Program. There was a 31% jump in all patients seeking counseling last fiscal year. Among that group was a large number of pregnant and new moms, who were impacted by the isolation and stress resulting from mandated restrictions. A YouTube yoga class and Zoom support group are also being offered.

In partnership with the CGH Diagnostic Imaging Department, the Foundation funds screening mammograms at no cost for area women, plus helps with diagnostic screenings, breast biopsies, ultrasounds, and MRIs. Comfort care bags and meals during chemotherapy are also sponsored for our cancer patients.

AirAuctioneer.com will be used again for the virtual auction and will go live on Ocober 20. Bidding runs from 7 a.m. Thursday, October 21 to 8 p.m. Tuesday, October 26. Ed Andersen Scholarship

Need funding for college?

Apply for the \$2,000 Ed Andersen Healthcare Scholarship, funded annually by the CGH Health Foundation. Deadline is Wednesday, September 15 at 5 p.m.

The Ed Andersen Healthcare Scholarship was established in 2014 by the CGH Board of Directors in gratitude for the former CGH CEO/President's exemplary career of more than 35 years. The healthcare scholarship is based on merit and financial need. Full- and part-time healthcare and nursing students may apply. Students already accepted into their professional school of study for either a nursing or healthcare degree are eligible.

Criteria:

- Reside in CGH Medical Center service area (includes Whiteside, Lee, Carroll, Ogle and Bureau counties)
- Demonstration of financial need; merit also considered
- Minimum 3.0 grade point average on a 4.0 scale overall or equivalent
- Proof of acceptance in accredited nursing program (CNA, CMA, LPN, RN, ADN, BSN, MSN, NP)

OR

Proof of acceptance in accredited healthcare program (such as physical therapy, speech pathology, pharmacy, emergency medical technician, radiology technology, dietitian, for example). (DOES NOT INCLUDE pre-med, pre-physical therapy and other type designations.)

Thank You Healthcare Heroes

On Wednesday, August 25, a horrific accident with fatalities happened on Route 30 between Sterling and Morrison. Nine people were involved



and all were transported to CGH. In addition to the ED team calling in extra staff, nurses and medical staff from throughout the hospital came to assist, and everyone came together as a team to handle the crisis. Our CGH staff went above and beyond to assist the family while they were at CGH, and after discharge, even drove them to a local hotel where they helped get them settled for the night. The family couldn't stop sharing how thankful they were to our entire care team for their compassion and assistance, even stating that this kind of "Good Samaritan help" would never happen in Chicago. Everyone went above and beyond to care for their physical and emotional well-being.

Since that time, rooms were booked for the family so they could rest and get things in order after the shock of yesterday's events, and the Salvation Army and Red Cross will likely be involved to help them transition to whatever is next for them.

We send our condolences to those involved in the accident, and sincere thanks to CGH EMS and EVERYONE who assisted in the ED during and immediately following this incident. We make a difference in the lives of our patients every day, but this was, as Dr. Steinke would say, a "defining moment" for this family. It is apparent they will never forget the care and compassion provided by our CGH family.
