Other toys are geared to therapy for gross and fine motor skills and pre-academic skills (cutting fruit, silly science, Vocab Bingo), as well as motivating toys that can be embedded in the therapy process to make it more enjoyable for the kids (token tower, tic-tac-toe, doll house). 
# Sue Maynard, RN Oncology
