CGH Recognizes DAISY Award Winner Shelly Lewis, RN

Shelly Lewis, a registered nurse from CGH Home Nursing, was recently recognized as a recipient of the prestigious DAISY Award for extraordinary nurses. An international program, the award is presented to nurses around the world who go above and beyond for their patients and demonstrate extraordinary compassionate care.

"I found Shelly to be compassionate and well qualified," said the nominator. "She was a good listener, competent, and knowledgeable when answering my questions. But she's more than that. She worked with me to come up with alternatives for my wound healing. She listened to me and combined what I thought would help with varieties of supplies. She was open to my suggestions on what I thought would work."

"It took a month of trial and error...mix and match...and thinking outside the box, but today the changes are apparent," continued the nominator. "Upon discharge from the hospital, I was afraid, insecure, confused, worried and on the edge of an anxiety attack. But today, I feel confident and knowledgeable about many difficulties and how to troubleshoot for solutions.

Because of Shelly I have a new skill set and can calmly proceed to the next phase - independent care of my colostomy." In addition, the nominator concluded, "I want to thank you for being calm when I was worried, helping me chuckle not fear, teaching me skills and believing in my abilities as well. When next we meet, I want to show you some of the innovative things I've worked on since the last time we met. Perhaps some of my ideas will help someone else as well...help them be calmer, have more confidence, adapt better, adjust to their new circumstances...and like you helped me to do...overcome their fears to become successful in their endeavors and rise to the challenges of having wounds and colostomy problems. Thank you again Shelly. Sincerely and with much gratitude."

The DAISY Award - an acronym for "Diseases Attacking the Immune System" - was established by the DAISY Foundation in California in memory of J. Patrick Barnes, who died at age 33 of an autoimmune disease. During his hospitalization, they deeply appreciated the care and compassion shown to Patrick and his entire family. When he died, they felt compelled to say "thank you" to nurses in a very public way. The DAISY Award continues to recognize and celebrate the outstanding professionalism and compassion that nurses bring to patients and their families every day.

The CGH Sleep Center offers a full range of sleep services, including EEGs and both in-lab and at-home sleep testing. In fact, during the past year, the CGH Sleep Lab has performed a total of 431 EEGs and 1,527 sleep studies!

Our sleep medicine team includes four Registered Polysomnographic Technologists (RPSGT). The four bedroom lab, which is accredited by the American Academy of Sleep Medicine (AASM), is fully equipped to diagnose and treat sleep disorders such as:

- * obstructive sleep apnea
- * narcolepsy
- * periodic limb movements
- * restless legs syndrome
- * REM behavior disorder
- * sleepwalking, and other disturbances.

Hospital Lobby Entrance

Effective today, the hospital main entrance will be locked daily, Monday through Thursday at 5:30 pm reopening the following morning at 5:00 am.

On Fridays the entrance will be locked at 5:30pm and will remain locked for the duration of the weekend and reopen Monday morning at 5:00 am.

All outpatient testing is already redirected to the ED entrance (this is normal off hours workflow) and there are no visitors at this point allowed outside of special circumstances. Therefore, this should not be a huge impact to departments.

If you are in an area that allows for circumstances outside of the noted main entrance hours, make sure you direct them to the ED entrance. A sign will be posted on an easel by the locked main entrance doors to redirect traffic to the ED entrance. All hospital temperature screeners are being shifted to help out in the ED lobby. This will continue to evolve so please be patient.
