CGH Health Foundation's Ninth Annual Virtual Delicious Designs Event Raises \$33,081


Thank you to the nearly 200 individuals and businesses who bid on Silent Auction items, sponsored a Wish List item for patients or a virtual table or dessert at the ninth annual virtual Delicious Designs event in October.

A record \$33,081 in net profit was raised with your support. Proceeds will fund the long-time CGH Health Foundation Women's Health Program and the new Dementia Project, which is the main focus of the 2022 Annual Appeal. Kudos to event Co-Chairs Lindsey Pistole, Vice President of Retail at Sauk Valley Bank; Gina Grennan, Director of CGH Diagnostic Imaging and the Northern Illinois Cancer Treatment Center; and Kayla Brown, Funeral Director with McDonald Funeral Home.

Our Women's Health Program was created in 1993. Last year, we assisted 534 women, and we've helped thousands of women over the years. We partner with CGH Medical Center in providing screening mammograms with no out-of-pocket costs to area women. Diagnostic tests, breast biopsies, ultrasounds and MRIs are also partially covered. Comfort bags for breast cancer patients and meals for CGH Medical Center chemotherapy patients are funded as well.

One of the biggest goals of the Dementia Project is to fund a Dementia Navigator for CGH who will be instrumental in guiding our dementia patients and families on their journey, similar to the breast navigator and oncology navigators the Foundation has helped fund. We are also organizing caregiver support groups, with the help of the Alzheimer's Association, hosting educational programs, developing a comprehensive listing of area and national dementia resources, providing funding for musical instruments for memory care centers, creating an assistance fund to help families with extra costs incurred with having someone with dementia in the family, and other activities.


Beautycounter Donates Pamper Bags

Work on Your Weight & Health



Are you are ready to work on your health and your weight in 2023? Please consider signing up for the CGH Health Transformation Program (HTP).

The Health Transformation Program (HTP) teaches participants how to lower blood pressure, control blood sugar, improve cholesterol numbers, and lose pounds and inches in the process. HTP is a one year commitment that includes classes every two weeks, individual counseling by a certified health coach, and quarterly lab work. The cost is only \$150.00 per year (\$6.00 per pay) but CGH employees get their money back at the end of every quarter as long as you attend class and complete the labs.
