CLARK FORK VALLEY HOSPITAL HEALTHCARE SCHOLARSHIP

Summary:

Clark Fork Valley Hospital is committed to supporting and improving healthcare services in Sanders County. As part of this commitment, our Governing Board provides an annual scholarship for Sanders County residents who are seeking a career in healthcare.

Guidelines:

Clark Fork Valley Hospital will offer one two-year scholarship annually for Sanders County residents seeking a career in an allied health field. This renewable scholarship program will be awarded competitively. Each scholarship is for \$2,500 per year for tuition and fees and is renewable once for the year after the scholarship is initially awarded. In addition, the student must continuously maintain good academic standing and maintain a 3.0 GPA or higher. The scholarship is limited to two consecutive years. Upon completion of their academic program, the student will be expected to apply to work at Clark Fork Valley Hospital and, if hired, work for a minimum of two years at the prevailing wage. If the student desires to work elsewhere or chooses to leave employment before the end of the two year period they must pay the hospital back their scholarship to release them from this obligation. This arrangement will be similar in structure to any other repayment agreement that the hospital enters into with an employee.

The hospital has no obligation to hire the individual and the extension of the scholarship is not to be considered an offer to work.

- All applications must be complete with the following supporting documentation:
 - 1. Three letters of reference from non-relatives
 - 2. Most recent high school or college transcript with Cumulative Grade Point Average
 - 3. Completed and typed application including answers to all application questions
 - 4. Current resume'

- Scholarships will be awarded on the basis of:
 - 1. Demonstrated commitment to community service
 - 2. Supplemental information requested with application
 - 3. Education and career objectives
- The Scholarship Committee will review all applications and determine which candidate will receive the available scholarships.
- Scholarship funds will be disbursed payable to the student and the school they will be attending upon receipt of documentation of acceptance and entry date from the Registrar of the school.
- Incomplete applications will not be reviewed.
- Applicants with a well articulated understanding of the demands of healthcare may be given preferential consideration
