Weather related fires

Fire Departments and Volunteer Fire Departments across DeWitt County and their fire fighters have been busy in the last week due to weather related fires. Fire fighters have been working fires in freezing temperatures and wind chills in the teens.

Nordhiem Volunteer Fire Department assisted by Yorktown Volunteer Fire Department responded to a structure fire on Friday, Jan. 6 at 3:40 p.m., that was fully involved when they arrived. The home was a total loss; however, the residents were not home at the time of the fire. It is believed that a heat lamp may have been the cause, that was used to keep a family pet warm during the cold temperatures.

Westhoff Volunteer Fire Department responded to a grass fire on Saturday, Jan. 7 at 12:25 a.m. It is believed that an electrical line in the high winds sparked and caused the fire.

Cuero Fire Department assisted by Cuero Volunteer Fire Department responded to a structure fire on Saturday, Jan. 7 at 6:30 a.m. The structure was fully involved on arrival. The resident was asleep at the time of the fire and woke up and tried to put the fire out. He received burns to his hands and feet and was flown to a San Antonio hospital as a precaution. The resident's dog died in the fire. The resident stated a pillow fell against the space heater next to the bed an ignited the fire.

Cuero Volunteer Fire Department assisted by Cuero Fire Department responded to a small barn fire on Saturday, Jan. 7 at 12:30 p.m. It is believed to have been started by a heat lamp used to keep some show pigs warm. At least two of the four show pigs

died in the fire and equipment was also

lost. Yoakum Volunteer Fire Department responded to a call Saturday, Jan. 7 at 12:40 p.m. for a control burn that got out of control. It is believed that the high winds caused the fire to become out of control.

During this cold weather, it is important to remember that space heaters are for heating a small room and the air in the room. Not just what is in front of it. If you can feel the direct heat from the heater you and anything near you is too close and could catch on fire. Make sure that nothing can fall or come in contact with the heater and unplug heaters and heat lamps when not in use. Do not leave space heaters unattended.

If a fire starts in your home, get you and your family out and then call 911. Do not go back in.
