Thanks to a caring



donor, we were even able to supply unique travel bags for new mothers to transport breast milk to nourish our most vulnerable patients, our babies.

The Citrus Valley Health Foundation Board of Trustees was hard at work serving as ambassadors in the community, sharing the strengths of Citrus Valley Health Partners with friends, family and business associates, as well as supporting events and programs that bring much-needed resources into the Foundation. Each member of the Board is committed for different reasons, but there is one common thread—our hospitals and hospice serve as their community healthcare provider.

Toward the end of the year, we formalized our planned giving program, allowing the Foundation to accept appreciated property. This resulted in wonderful tax-wise gift options for donors and awesome support for CVHP programs.

At Foothill Presbyterian Hospital, work continued toward the completion of the Geleris Family Education Center. The existing building was transformed from common office and meeting space to generous-sized meeting areas and offices, a private meeting section for patients, plus a centrally located kitchenette, open to everyone. The newly renovated Education Center will have state-of-the-art audiovisual equipment including conferencing ability with other sites within CVHP. The center will also provide meeting space for other organizations within the local community. The renovations are made possible through the generous support of the Geleris Family Foundation, Carl E. Citrus Valley Hospice continues to receive support from friends throughout the San Gabriel Valley. Grateful patient families found comfort and companionship with the return of the Light Up A Life event in December. Albert Cortez, local businessman and Hospice advocate, was recognized as the 2016 Light Up A Life honoree for his work alongside CVHP Board of Directors Chairman Walter Allen III. Thanks to the efforts of these two gentlemen, the Dare to Care fundraiser was held this past August, with great success.

Inter-Community Hospital ushered in the start of the year with the grand opening of its newly renovated and expanded Emergency Department. The Inter-Community Hospital Auxiliary was instrumental in supporting this project with a gift of \$300,000, then committing an additional \$200,000 upon completion! This group of outstanding individuals works tirelessly to support ICH through vendor and gift shop sales, plus operating the Bargain Box in downtown Covina, not to mention thousands of hours of volunteer service for patients and staff.

Queen of the Valley Hospital began actively planning for the expansion of its Emergency Department, which upon completion will accommodate 150,000 patient visits a year, doubling the number of current visits. Stay tuned for more about this project in the coming months as CVHP prepares for the future healthcare needs of the San Gabriel Valley. This monumental project will require support from our staff, administration, board members and community members, as well as corporate and foundation support. We can't accomplish this on our own! In the pages that follow, you'll understand why we won't need to.

All three Citrus Valley Health Partners auxiliary groups provide a level of service and contribution that is inspiring, but put the three together and their power and passion become irreplaceable. Their capacity to mobilize was evident last spring with the first-ever joint presentation of Corks & Forks, a fine wine and craft beer fundraiser held at The Farm at Fairplex in Pomona.

Traditionally an event sponsored solely by the Auxiliary of Foothill Presbyterian Hospital, Corks & Forks 2016 demonstrated the dynamism of teamwork as volunteers from Inter-Community and Queen of the Valley hospitals joined in the effort to secure support of nearly \$34,000 for CVHP. More than 200 guests enjoyed San Gabriel Valley wines and craft beers, tasty food and music of the Sound Bytes, all while bidding at the silent auction and buying opportunities for a 28-bottle wine cooler.

Auxiliary Presidents Janice Clark, PhD; Bonnie Kasamatsu; and Bonnie Singleton provided leadership and agreed the joint endeavor generated multiple benefits. Queen of the Valley's Bonnie Kasamatsu remarked on the unique blending of skills and talents as they all worked together. Foothill Presbyterian's Bonnie Singleton noted the joint event required more coordination, but the opportunity to meet and interact with the other volunteers made it all worthwhile, especially during the work on the silent auction. "It was fun working with the other auxiliary groups," says Bonnie. "I've been able to maintain some of the new relationships with volunteers I ordinarily wouldn't have gotten to know."

#### THE BIG IMPACT: HOPE AND HEALING

Auxiliary fundraising consistently yields record-level giving, which impacts patients, families and employees throughout CVHP hospitals. Gifts target specific needs such as the specialized Giraffe OmniBeds for the NICU at Queen of the Valley Hospital as well as pledged support for significant projects like the Inter-Community Hospital emergency department and the Foothill Presbyterian Hospital outpatient surgery center. Scholarships, often in a health-related field, are also funded through auxiliary efforts.







The simple act of breathing, an involuntary action for most, becomes a minute-by-minute decision and struggle for those diagnosed with chronic obstructive lung disease. Learning to cope with the challenges of respiratory disease becomes a little easier with the support of Inter-Community Hospital's Breath Savers. Established in 1970, the group is an outreach of the Pulmonary Rehabilitation department and is committed to providing education, support and social activities for those living with lung disease.

Karl and Carol Urlie are a testament to the quality and commitment of the volunteers leading the Breath Savers effort. After completing the physician-prescribed, eight-week pulmonary rehab program in 1999, Karl joined Breath Savers and soon was serving on the volunteer board as vice-president, president and then past-president. His wife, Carol, has served as treasurer since 2006.

"It's a group effort," says Karl, "and Carol and I serve willingly." They enjoy the camaraderie of the monthly luncheons, educational programs and trips, but it is the year-over-year success of the club's major fundraiser, the annual Sheldon Houghton Memorial Walk-a-thon, that provides the most satisfaction. Proceeds from the walk-a-thon (\$16,000 in 2016) benefit pulmonary patients in the form of scholarships, enabling those patients without the ability to pay or those with a high insurance copay to participate in both the pulmonary rehab program (exercise and education) and the eight-week maintenance phase.

The 8th Annual Sheldon Houghton Memorial Walk-a-thon was held on October 14, 2017, at Covina Park. If you are interested in more information about Breath Savers, please call Pulmonary Rehabilitation at (626) 915-6283.



Blanca Siebels is grateful. A 50-something mother of three, she had been diagnosed with end-stage lung disease. She fully credits the Inter-Community Hospital pulmonary rehab program and scholarship with her treatment success. Blanca is one of nearly 60 patients in the rehab program and 100 in the maintenance phase to benefit from the scholarship monies.









Cotton candy, cupcakes, pink lemonade and strawberry ice cream with toppings. Sound yummy? These goodies, sold at South Hills Academy's "Pink Shack" last October, helped raise funds benefiting the Citrus Valley Health Partners Resource Center in Covina. Led by the student council, the school's sixth through twelfth graders organized and participated in this and other creative fundraising events in support of CVHP. Their October "Pink Out" was a student versus staff soccer game with ticketed admission, and the "Free Dress Day" allowed students to wear their street clothes at a price: \$1 for jeans.

For South Hills Academy students in West Covina, being involved in the community is part of learning to become a global citizen. Established in 1957, the Academy educates and nurtures students to become ambassadors and leaders, socially engaged and successful in their community. Mary Jo Clifford, student council advisor and English instructor, says, "Being involved with a school that gives back and makes a difference in the community is an extremely rewarding experience. It has been my pleasure to nurture this kind of spirit in my students."

South Hills Academy's small acts of kindness translate to good news for Citrus Valley Health Partners and the Resource Center. At the center, patients, family members and the community are encouraged to seek cancer information which will help them understand a diagnosis, disease process and recommended treatments. The center houses books, brochures, magazines, resource directories, videos, audiotapes, interactive CDs, and a computer for Internet access. Support group, physician referral and clinical trial information is also available.

# ADVANCING CULTURALLY RESPONSIVE CARE: TRUSTEE KENNETH KASAMATSU SPEARHEADS NEW COUNCIL

Upon retirement from a stellar banking career based in Los Angeles, Kenneth Kasamatsu wasted no time getting involved in the life of his home community and its healthcare. Joining the Citrus Valley Health Foundation Board in January 2016, Ken served on the Finance committee. At year's end, Ken commented at a board meeting that, excepting physicians, he was the only Asian on the Foundation board, and his wife, Bonnie, was one of a few Asian volunteers in the hospital auxiliary. Ken believed that since the Asian population represented approximately 30% of people within the hospitals' service area, Citrus Valley Health Partners was missing out on hearing the voice of a major part of the community it hopes to serve.

Along with CVHP's Vice President for Strategy and Decision Support Sajid Sindha and Chief Strategy Officer Martin Kleinbart, MD, Ken and a former board member convened a meeting in early 2017 with prominent individuals from the Asian community, soliciting their thoughts and experiences. It was evident there was a need for more inclusivity of all ethnicities. Ken explains, "We want to create a reputation of not only providing excellent medical care, but at the same time, be equipped to welcome folks who need support in different languages and cultures, whether it involves reading hospital signage or having appropriate choices on the hospital menu."

Working in collaboration with CVHP President and CEO Robert Curry and other hospital leadership and disciplines, Ken successfully kicked off the Culturally Responsive Care Council in July 2017. Its objective: creating an environment that proactively meets the diverse needs of healthcare consumers (communities, patients, employees, physicians and volunteers) in order to enhance the overall healthcare experience.

# FROM MOM TO MOM: A GIFT BORN OUT OF GRATITUDE

The gift of a thermal tote bag. It seems like such a small gesture. In fact, it plays an important role in delivering essential nourishment to a most vulnerable population: breast milk to premature infants at Queen of the Valley Hospital's 40-bed NICU. Heather Puckett, an independent consultant with Thirty-One Gifts, spearheaded the fundraiser in response to the life-saving care given to her prematurely born daughter, Shelby.

Heather and her husband, Kent, reside in Orange County. Due to an extensive remodeling project on their home, they decided Heather should spend the final months of her pregnancy at her mother's home in West Covina. Heather made appointments with a new obstetrician and planned to have her baby at Queen of the Valley Hospital. Four weeks before the due date, Heather unexpectedly went into labor. With no time to spare, baby Shelby was born in her grandmother's home, resulting in admission of both mother and baby into Queen of the Valley Hospital. Heather entered the emergency room in shock, while the baby was taken to the NICU.

As both mother and baby recovered, it was important to Heather that she manage to pump and deliver enough breast milk from home to her newborn in the NICU. She used a thermal tote from her bag collection to transport the milk and says she never missed a feeding. Thankful for the care given to Shelby, Heather knew she had to find a way to give back. She utilized social media to promote a NICU Welcome Bag campaign, filled the bags with small essentials for new parents and delivered the thermal bags to the NICU to distribute to other moms. "The nurses have my gratitude for a lifetime," says Heather. "They took care of my baby when I couldn't, and I just fell in love with all of them. Giving these tote bags to other moms is one small way for me to say thank you."

### MAN'S BEST FRIEND: PET THERAPY'S UNIQUE BRAND OF CHEER BENEFITS PATIENTS

If you see a dog wearing goggles, driving a miniature two-tone Volkswagen bus down the hallway during your next visit to Queen of the Valley Hospital, please don't panic. Go ahead and smile. It's Sancho, an 11-year old purebred Parson Russell Terrier, trained by his owner and volunteer handler Troy. Sancho and Troy are part of the Citrus Valley Health Partners Pet Therapy Program, first launched in 2008 at Inter-Community Hospital and now in place at all three CVHP hospitals.

Pet therapy, also known as animal-assisted therapy, utilizes dogs to provide a welcome distraction for people coping with health issues. Studies have shown that pet therapy helps alleviate pain, reduces stress and improves the overall well-being of patients. Tiffany Ramirez, corporate director of CVHP volunteer services, manages the program, which consists of 13 volunteer handlers and ten dogs. "I'm so grateful for these individuals and their wonderful dogs," says Tiffany. "We are fortunate to have dedicated volunteers who give their time to bring cheer to our patients."

As a volunteer, Troy secured training for Sancho through the Alliance of Therapy Dogs, a national organization providing training, registration, support and insurance for members who volunteer with a therapy dog. For Troy, finding an organization which allowed Sancho to wear a costume and ride in a remote-controlled car was an important aspect of the training. "Sancho and I volunteer together four times a week, and kids love to see his costumes," says Troy. "He's Uncle Sam on Independence Day and wears reindeer antlers during the Christmas holidays. He just brightens everyone's day."

# **Endowment: Building** a **Philanthropic Tradition**

Endowment represents an institution's active planning for the future. It is a source of funds that acts as a financial anchor for a non-profit organization.

# 01

#### **HOW TO BEGIN:**

A donor creates an endowment by asking that the funds remain intact with only the earnings being spent to support a specific project. Trustees of the non-profit determine a spending policy annually that provides for a percentage of the earnings to be spent, with the corpus held in perpetuity.

## 02

#### **HOW IT WORKS:**

Earnings on endowments may support programs, building expansions or may be unrestricted. These important commitments provide a measure of financial stability for the future. The principal can never be invaded except under the most unusual set of circumstances, and only with board of trustee approval.

# 03

#### **GET STARTED:**

To create a permanent, named endowment in support of Citrus Valley Health Partners, the donor needs to make a minimum commitment of \$50,000. Gifts of any size may be added to the established endowment fund at any time in the future.

Through smart charitable planning, you can shape the future of Citrus Valley Health Partners beyond what you thought possible. A planned gift not only impacts your financial goals and tax benefits, it directs your passion to make a lasting impact on the people and places most important to you.

#### THE CHARITABLE GIFT ANNUITY

To create a charitable gift annuity (CGA), the donor makes a permanent gift of cash, securities or real estate to create a stream of payments and reduce taxes. to Citrus Valley Health Foundation. In return, Citrus Valley Before listing appreciated real estate property for Health Foundation agrees to make stable, periodic payments (an annuity) to one or two people (annuitants) for their lifetimes. When the annuitants have passed away and the annuity ends, Citrus Valley Health Foundation uses the remaining funds to support its mission.

#### What are the benefits?

- The donor can turn cash, securities or real estate into a guaranteed stream of payments for one or two people for the rest of their lives.
- The annuity payments are stable regardless of changes in the economy.
- The donor receives a charitable income-tax deduction for the gift portion of the CGA.
- Annuity payments are partially income-tax free, often for many years.
- If the donor uses appreciated property to fund the CGA, the donor can avoid the capital gains tax on the exchange that funds the CGA.
- When one annuitant passes away, the other annuitant will continue to receive the total annuity amount.
- CGA rates depend on the annuitant's age.
- CGA programs are regulated by law and are guaranteed.
- CGAs are flexible and can be planned to meet the donor's needs. Payments can begin immediately or be deferred until a future date, for a higher rate.

#### GIFTS OF APPRECIATED REAL ESTATE

Appreciated real estate that is debt free can be used sale, an owner needs to transfer the property to a Charitable Remainder Trust (CRT) or CGA that will benefit Citrus Valley Health Foundation in the future. This presale transfer qualifies the donor to avoid the long-term capital gain on the sale of the property.

#### What are the benefits?

- The owner can choose one or more income beneficiary(s) that would receive variable payments from the CRT for their lifetimes or for a term of up to 20 years.
- There is no capital gains tax to be paid when the donor transfers appreciated real estate to the CRT before the property is listed for sale.
- The donor receives a charitable income-tax deduction for the future value of the gift to Citrus Valley Health Foundation.
- While in the CRT, the property grows on a tax-free basis. If the trustee sells CRT property and reinvests the proceeds, there are no taxes on the sale.
- When one income beneficiary passes away, any surviving income beneficiary retains the same rights to receive the income from the CRT.
- The CRT gives the owner more control of the investments in this Trust.

#### **GIFTS OF RESERVED LIFE ESTATE**

The donor makes a permanent transfer of a home, condominium, vacation home or farm/ranch to Citrus Valley Health Foundation. The donor and Citrus Valley Health Foundation agree that the donor and the donor's spouse can continue to use the property for their lifetimes. The donor continues to pay for maintenance, insurance and taxes on the property.

#### What are the benefits?

- The donor receives a charitable income-tax deduction for the future value of the gift to Citrus Valley Health Foundation.
- This deduction will offset the donor's future payments for maintenance, insurance and taxes on the property.
- The transferred real estate is not part of the donor's estate, avoiding probate and possibly reducing the estate tax.

#### GIFTS OF APPRECIATED STOCK AND OTHER SECURITIES

Giving long-term appreciated stock or other securities to Citrus Valley Health Foundation can be more beneficial for the donor than giving the equivalent amount of cash.

#### What are the benefits?

- When long-term appreciated stock is donated to Citrus Valley Health Foundation, the donor avoids paying a capital gains tax on that stock.
- This tax savings makes the "cost" to the donor of the gift lower than if the donor made an equivalent contribution of cash.
- The donor receives an immediate income-tax deduction for the gift.



### GENERATIONS OF GOODWILL: GRANDMOTHER INSPIRES ADMISSIONS DIRECTOR LORI BRYANT

Ask Lori Bryant what philanthropy means to her and she will have a lot to say about her grandmother, who migrated to the United States from Czechoslovakia. Lori spent many of her formative years with her grandmother, learning the lessons of being charitable.

Known as the "doll lady," Lori's grandmother placed collection boxes at local stores, churches and businesses so others could drop off their used dolls. She repaired the dolls and took them to orphanages and churches to share with little girls. In addition to her full-time job (working to provide a comfortable life for her four children), she worked tirelessly on the dolls in the evening in order to have a full box to deliver every weekend.

Today, Lori continues her grandmother's example of goodwill. Currently serving as director of admissions and registration for Citrus Valley Health Partners, Lori has been with the organization for 22 years, participating in the I AM CVHP employee giving program through payroll deduction since she started in 1995. She believes in the CVHP mission to help people keep well in body, mind and spirit and feels a closeness to the hospital community. "I consider this my home away from home, my second family," says Lori.

By participating in the I AM CVHP program, Lori demonstrates her willingness to give above and beyond her everyday work. "It feels good to know I can help change the outcome of someone's life," says Lori. "I look forward to continuing to give."




