

Emanate Health Expansion

Expanding Care in Our Communities

Emanate Health is focused on growth and development to enhance its care for the one million people who live in the San Gabriel Valley. The organization has embarked on a journey to transform the patient experience, deliver on patient expectations for quality health care and expand on-demand access to meet patient needs. Construction of these projects will start in 2021.



EMANATE HEALTH INTER-COMMUNITY HOSPITAL Third Catheterization Laboratory

Existing space will be repurposed to build a third catheterization laboratory to support the hospital's Heart Center. It will support the growing number of heart patients in the San Gabriel Valley. Emanate Health Inter-Community Hospital is designated as a ST-Elevation Myocardial Infarction (STEMI) Receiving Center and regularly receives patients from other health care facilities. Rendering currently not available

EMANATE HEALTH INTER-COMMUNITY HOSPITAL Main Entrance & Front Lobby

This project will reconfigure the main entrance, expand the lobby and add a new aesthetically pleasing façade. The enlarged lobby will include remodeled admissions, security and information counters. It will also include an upgraded gift shop and a coffee kiosk. The flow of traffic in front of the main entrance will also be redesigned. Creating a new facade and front lobby is beneficial to enhancing the patient and visitor experience, and will pay tribute to the hospital's Heart Center.



EMANATE HEALTH QUEEN OF THE VALLEY HOSPITAL Emergency Department & Intensive Care Unit

A new two-story, 60,000-square-foot building will include a 60-bed Emergency Department (ED) on the first floor and 24-bed Intensive Care Unit (ICU) on the second floor. The new ED will have the capacity to serve 120,000+ patient visitors a year. The current ED only has 26 beds and was originally built to accommodate 40,000 visits a year. Today, the ED serves 80,000 visitors a year and demand is growing. Also, 24 new ICU beds will be added to the existing 18 beds for a total of 42.



EMANATE HEALTH QUEEN OF THE VALLEY HOSPITAL **Medical Arts Building II**

Another new two-story, 60,000-square-foot building will house an outpatient Ambulatory Surgery Center with six operating rooms and Cancer Center on the first floor, and an Infusion Center with radiation and chemotherapy capabilities, along with hospital-based clinics, on the second floor. It will provide enhanced patient services and state-of-the-art cancer care services to this area of the San Gabriel Valley. It will also include a new 4-story 400-space parking structure.

Healthy Family, Healthy Life Honoring a Board Trustee and Veteran OB/GYN

or a devoted family man like Dumrong Tangchitnob, MD, FACOG, choosing to bring new life into the world as an obstetrician/ gynecologist (OB/GYN) was an obvious choice. And opting to align with Emanate Health was a perfect fit.

As a father of two successful physicians and husband of 42 years, appreciating the significance of a healthy family is inherently who Dr. Tangchitnob is. "When I was in medical school, I truly realized that women go through a lot," he explained. "They go through dynamic changes every month, having babies, hormonal fluctuations. I believe the best thing in life is family, and the woman is the most important part."

That realization, along with his upbringing in Bangkok where the importance of empathy was instilled early on, led him to become a doctor focusing on women's health. "In Thailand, you are [considered] part of the family as a physician," Dr. Tangchitnob explained. "There is honor in it."

FAMILY FIRST

This focus on family and empathy has been passed down through generations among the Tangchitnobs. His brother is a fellow OB/GYN, and now both of Dr. Tangchitnob's grown children have followed in their footsteps.

He is fortunate to practice medicine alongside his son, Edward, a robotic gynecologic surgeon and functional integrative physician who joined his practice nine years ago. "He carries on my mission into the next century by infusing my preexisting practice with advanced technology," Dr. Tangchitnob shared. "I'm very proud of him." In addition, Dr. Tangchitnob's daughter, Pamela, is a practicing physician specializing in geriatrics and palliative care.

Happily married since 1979, Dr. Tangchitnob deeply respects his wife, Suphang, and places family above all else. "I couldn't have come this far without my wife," he relayed. "I was away in training for seven years. She supported me and raised two children by herself.

"I respect women more

and more because of what I've seen her go through," he continued. "She sacrificed her life and freedom for her family. She's my life partner."

EVOLUTION OF OBSTETRICS

Having begun his career as an OB/GYN upwards of 40 years ago, Dr. Tangchitnob has witnessed the evolution of obstetrics and gynecology firsthand. When he completed his medical training in the late 1970s while in the Air Force in Thailand, fetal monitoring for a woman in labor consisted of checking the baby's heart rate with a stethoscope every half hour leading up to delivery. In contrast, Dr. Tangchitnob can now monitor deliveries wirelessly on a smartphone

thanks to the advanced medical technology implemented at Emanate Health.

COMMUNITY FOCUS

Serving on the Emanate Health Foundation Board of Trustees since 2015, Dr. Tangchitnob helps to usher in funds to ensure Emanate Health remains on the cutting edge of diagnostics and treatment. He also does his part to nurture the relationship with medical staff, helping to ensure physicians feel supported and maintain the drive that brought them to the medical field.

It is beyond doubt, that Dr. Tangchitnob's love for the community — and for Emanate Health — has only grown in the past decades.

Comforts of Home Emanate Health Hospice Renovation

manate Health Hospice is a unique place that provides an invaluable service to patients and families during their darkest hours. With usually only about a week to care for each patient and give solace to a family saying final goodbyes, every detail — both big and small matters. And caring for patients in a space that feels warm and comforting becomes especially important.

Thanks to the generous contribution of a long-time donor, the renovations underway at Emanate Health Hospice building are enabling staff members to do just that. Upgrades that include fresh flooring and paint, a new meditation garden, a repaved

parking lot and a new front entrance update will all create a warmer, more modern environment for patients and families. In addition, finer touches such as installation of frosted glass in key areas add privacy where it's needed most.

JEWEL OF THE COMMUNITY

As one of the few freestanding hospices on the West Coast, Emanate Health Hospice is a jewel of the San Gabriel Valley. Recognized with a four-star rating by the Hospital Consumer Assessment of Healthcare Providers and Systems (HCAHPS), the hospice provides a continuum of care for its patients that includes symptom control and short-term crisis management,

as well as family respite care, providing a higher overall quality of service to both patients and families.

"We provide physical, emotional, psychological and spiritual support for patients and their families while in our hospice care," explained Gilda Dominguez, MS, CCC-SLP, CSSGB, Director of Hospice. "The hospice environment provides round-the-clock care in a clean, comfortable, peaceful and private space with family visitation. We want it to feel like a home."

It is clear this is their mission and purpose. According to the hospice benefactor who wishes to remain anonymous, "The staff members are so loving and thoughtful to both the

patients and their loved ones."

For example, when the donor's sibling received care at Emanate Health Hospice, they happened to share their Native American heritage with the Hospice Chaplain. Taking the detail to heart, the Chaplain thoughtfully gifted them a set of objects traditionally used by Native Americans to honor a loved one in their final days. This is a true testament to the exceptional care provided by hospice staff.

EXPERT ADVICE

The positive response to the renovation was built into the planning. The areas chosen for upgrades were carefully identified based on feedback from those who are most familiar

with the space — hospice staff members. The staff were involved from the beginning of the planning phases. As a result, Gilda shared that "the hospice staff feel valued and appreciated.

"We are very appreciative of the commitment to the hospice team to provide a more comforting and modern environment," she went on to say. "Thank you to all of those who have been a part of this project."

LUIS GARCIA-AYALA, MD

Emanate Health Family Medicine

Having begun his career working in an impoverished community in Mexico, Luis Garcia-Ayala, MD, came to Emanate Health knowing that serving a disadvantaged community

means providing more than standard health care.

"This population needs a physician who is really engaged, who can understand and connect with them to provide a high quality of care," Dr. Garcia explained. "[Given my background,] I can really understand the patient and their culture."

At times, doing whatever it takes means helping patients find resources in support of maintaining their health. Thankfully, Emanate Health is able to provide leading-edge diagnostics and treatment because of donor support, resulting in exceptional care for patients. "The technology there [where I practiced in Mexico]

isn't the same as what we can offer here," Dr. Garcia noted.

BENEDICTA OMOKO, MD **East Valley Community Health Center**

Originally from Nigeria, Benedicta Omoko, MD, has witnessed the inequalities in health care that exist across the world, which helped prepare her for her current role.

"Growing up in a society with challenges to accessing adequate health care, I find fulfillment in advocating for the less privileged and narrowing health care disparities," Dr. Omoko explained.

She is grateful for being part of the Emanate Health Family Medicine Residency Program.


"Being in the pioneer class, with the challenges that came with it, my peers and I became creative, resilient and compassionate doctors," she reflected. "We drew strength from each other, which created a bond that we share to this day."

JAMES PEARSON, MD **East Valley Community Health Center**

James Pearson, MD, grew up in Davis, a rural farming community in Northern California. He was Emanate Health's first Chief Resident. When asked about his motivation to build the **Emanate Health Family Medicine** Residency Program, Dr. Pearson explained, "I liked that it was just starting, and there was a lot of enthusiasm to create something new that focused on both education and community service. I was impressed with the faculty and supporting specialist attending physicians from day one."

Since graduation, Dr. Pearson has returned to support incoming residents by serving as a clinical attending in the program. Through this role, he hopes to pass along the wisdom imparted on him during his residency.

Drs. Garcia-Ayala, Omoko and Pearson are the first graduates who remained within the Emanate Health family, and we are grateful for their devotion to serving the San Gabriel Valley.

PLANNED GIVING

Thanks to Miss Chapman's Gift Inter-Community Hospital Faces Pandemic Head-On

here are few areas of a hospital that are more critical to patient care than the entrance to the Emergency Department (ED).

Undoubtedly the busiest area of the hospital, the entry to Emanate Health Inter-Community Hospital's ED welcomes upwards of 115 patients on a normal day. When you take into account the number of nurses, medical staff and support staff on hand to treat patients in the ED, not to mention the paramedics who come and go, it's clear how fundamental the layout of the Emergency Department is to its functionality

Thankfully, the renovation of Inter-Community Hospital's ED has not only increased the capacity to see patients, it has

greatly improved upon the patient waiting area — creating a more welcoming environment with better flow for patient triage. Since nearly 80 percent of patients come to the Emergency Department on a walk-in basis, special emphasis was placed on the entrance, including four private rapid treatment rooms that enable staff to quickly assess incoming patients upon arrival.

"The current design flows a lot better," explained Kevin Hua, DO, Director of Emergency Department Operations at Inter-Community Hospital. "It is a big welcome air relief for patients and the community." As a result, patient satisfaction scores have risen dramatically since the update and are now

in the 70th to 80th percentile according to Dr. Hua.

This is thanks to the generosity of Miss Joyce Chapman in naming the Inter-Community ED renovation in her trust before her passing early last year. Upon its completion, Emanate Health named the department's Joyce M. Chapman Lobby in appreciation for her philanthropy.

The effects have been felt by department staff as well as patients. "When the staff got to see the blueprint and all the hard work, they were really happy," Dr. Hua recalled.

After returning to the updated department, staff were pleased to see the extra space, enhancements to patient privacy, and how patient-friendly

it was overall, shared Laurie McCully, MSN, RN, NEA-BC, Director of Emergency & Critical Care Services at Inter-Community Hospital.

Having been completed

just a few years ago, these improvements couldn't have come at a better time, enabling staff to acclimate to the new layout before the pandemic began. When the ED was at its busiest, there were triage area canopies set up outside to prescreen patients for COVID-19 symptoms prior to entry. Once cleared, patients entered the department to be greeted by a triage nurse. "There's a nurse close by if they have questions so patients know they haven't been forgotten," explained

According to Laurie, "We're happy to be here to take care of the community, and having a bigger department has helped us. The pandemic definitely pushed us to our limits and beyond, but in general it's so much better."

"Our staff has done a really good job of adapting, staying engaged, continuing to do their best to ensure everyone receives top care," relayed Dr. Hua. "Our goal is to ensure we're keeping our community healthy and well, and making it the facility of choice for our family members."

Dedicated Occupational Therapist Finds 'Forever Home' at Emanate Health

n talking with Floyd Tran, OTD, OTR/L, his passion for his job is palpable the moment he begins explaining his role in the Neonatal Intensive Care Unit (NICU) at Emanate Health Queen of the Valley Hospital.

Floyd began his career at Emanate Health working with adults who have neurological disorders and has since completed training in areas such as stroke, lymphedema and hand therapy. He found his home in the NICU about a year ago and hasn't looked back. Floyd now spends his days doing therapy with infants, helping tiny people do mini exercises while educating new parents on the basics of caring for and feeding the new member of their family.

AN OT FIRST

Having earned both master's and doctorate degrees in occupational therapy and continuing to pursue ongoing education through employer-sponsored training, it's clear that Floyd has found his forever home in both his chosen career and employer. He is a strong believer in research and evidence-based practices in treating patients. "They [Emanate Health] have really harbored my growth and professionalism," explained Floyd.

While he now serves as a supervisor maintaining regulatory standards across all three Emanate Health hospitals — as well as at an Emanate Health outpatient clinic in Glendora Floyd's first love will always be his role as an Occupational

Therapist (OT). According to Floyd, "I'm an OT first, being a manager is second. My heart is with my patients."

"The hospital can be a scary place," Floyd went on to say. "I feel like I get to bring a personal level to my patients and their families, to give them a sense of humanness."

A LOVE FOR THERAPY

Floyd's foray into patient care began in 2009 when he started as a volunteer at both Inter-Community Hospital and Queen of the Valley Hospital. "When I was volunteering, I fell in love with therapy," Floyd recalled. "It felt like the best of both worlds — not just the physical aspects of care, but mental and spiritual as well.

I can't believe they pay me to do this — it's so rewarding."

WHO WE ARE

Floyd was hired on as an employee in 2013 and has continued progressing in his career, being promoted to lead therapist and more recently to a supervisory role within Emanate Health Sports Medicine & Rehabilitation. In 2015, he decided to start giving back through the Emanate Health Employee Giving Program.

"I felt like I wanted to give back because of what it's given me," Floyd explained. "This is my community. If you work here, and you live here, this is your hospital. If my dad gets sick, he's coming here. My sister's been sick, and she came here. This is who we are."

PRIDE AND TRUST

Working in health care during the COVID-19 pandemic has only reinforced Floyd's pride and trust in Emanate Health. "In the beginning [of the pandemic], I felt relieved to work at a hospital and for our organization," Floyd explained. "This is a hospital, so we know how to handle these situations.

"I have a lot of pride working here, and I know other people do too," Floyd continued. "It's just different — it's a real family here. And whatever you put into it, you get out of it."






















EDUCATE COMMUNITY, VIRTUALLY FROM ANYWHERE



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A LETTER FROM ROBERT H. CURRY

The year 2020 was like no other in our lives. While the COVID-19 pandemic changed our daily routines, it did not stop Emanate Health's commitment to enhance the health and wellness of the one million people that we serve in the San Gabriel Valley. It only enhanced our resolve to live by our mission.

Emanate Health exists to help people keep well in body, mind and spirit by providing quality health care services in a safe, compassionate environment. Despite the virus, Emanate Health reached new heights of achievement.

We opened the Emanate Health Care Center, our new outpatient clinic, to provide communities with easy access to comprehensive

services right in their own backyard. Care Center patients will see doctors who specialize in Family Medicine, Cardiology, Pediatrics, Orthopedics, OB/GYN and Neurology.

Emanate Health successfully issued \$170 million in bonds securities which were in high demand from investors. Proceeds from the bond sale will help to fund the construction of a 24-bed Intensive Care Unit and the expansion of the Emergency Department to 60 beds at Queen of the Valley Hospital

(QVH), among other projects in the region. For the first time, vascular surgeons at Inter-

Community Hospital in Covina successfully conducted minimally invasive surgeries designed to prevent stroke for high-risk patients that need carotid intervention. In addition, QVH was designated a Primary Plus Stroke Center in 2020, a major step on the road to

becoming a Comprehensive Stroke Center in 2021, as designated by the Los Angeles Emergency Medical Services.

Emanate Health graduated the first class of its Family Medicine Residency Program during an outdoor, socially distanced ceremony in the parking lot at QVH. The three-year program allows us to help train the next generation of physicians and address a shortage of doctors in the area.

We also launched a series of Ask The Doctor segments on health care topics to educate the community on the impact of COVID-19 on their health. Campaigns on several platforms allowed us to highlight our safety and cleanliness protocols so patients could feel comfortable receiving treatment at our facilities.

A virtual tour of the Family Birth & Newborn Center gave expectant moms a feel for the facility that brings new babies into the world every day.

To reach these milestones, we're blessed to have the support of Emanate Health Foundation and a network of selfless volunteers and contributors who share our vision, mission and values. We also must thank the Foundation for launching the COVID-19 Relief Fund, which was invaluable in providing our clinical teams with resources and medications to treat patients and battle the virus in our hospitals.
