Legacy of longtime Queen of the Valley nurse endures through loving memories and support

Though she passed away more than 14 years ago, the legacy of longtime Emanate Health Queen of the Valley Hospital (QVH) nurse Diane Moore is still very much alive for her family and friends. “She inspired us to be better people and help others,” shared her older brother, Brian Patrick Moore. For nearly 40 years, Diane worked as a critical care nurse for QVH, treating patients in the Intensive Care Unit (ICU) and Cardiac Care Unit (CCU) before becoming a discharge manager. “Being a nurse was not just a job for Diane, but a vocation,” noted Diane’s cousin, Marylou Stenger.

When Diane became ill prior to her passing in 2010, she received compassionate care at the same hospital where she had previously treated countless patients. Her family wrote in her obituary: “The love and respect in which she was held by colleagues was clearly evident in their unstinting efforts on her behalf, and by their tender care of her in her final days.” After her death, several of Diane’s siblings and family members made contributions in her memory to Emanate Health Foundation. “She was a true saint who never thought of herself, and we want her legacy to continue.”
