August is National Immunization Awareness Month (NIAM). During NIAM, Gold Coast Health Plan (GCHP) encourages providers to protect patients of all ages against vaccine-preventable diseases through on-time vaccinations.

Providers are encouraged to ensure patients are up-to-date on recommended vaccines. Research has consistently shown that health care professionals are the most trusted source for vaccine information among parents and patients.

 highlights the importance of protecting patients against influenza, the Vaccines for Children
 (VFC) Program efforts to improve vaccine uptakes, and strategies for increasing overall
 immunization coverage.
- <u>"Afternoon TEAch with CDPH"</u> is a free webinar series that covers a variety of immunization topics.
