

Mask Reprocessing Center now open to all clinical areas

N95 Respirator decontamination and re-use process



DROP OFF

- Dirty drop off areas have been designated inside each clinical area. Check with your manager regarding location
- All N95 Respirators MUST be labeled with your first initial, last name, date of first use and department location (this is important to ensure return of <u>your</u> mask)

- All used N95 respirators are to be discarded in your "dirty" paper bag
- DO NOT throw out your N95 respirators after the 5th cycle. You still need to send it down for decontamination so the staff can issue you a new mask

WHAT HAPPENS IN THE REPROCESSING CENTER?

- Tally marks will be added to the respirator by decontamination staff each time the mask undergoes the decontamination process.
- The masks can be decontaminated a total of five cycles. This will be monitored by the decontamination staff and new N95 respirators will be issued and returned in a clean bag to the staff member
- All decontaminated N95 Respirators will be kept in the "clean" paper bag

PICK UP

- Respirators sent for decontamination will be returned to you in a new "clean" paper bag stapled at the top
- Daily pick up is located in your areas designated "clean" area
- Each health care professional is responsible for ensuring the proper fit, performing respirator seal check and integrity of each respirator upon re-use

DAILY USE

- Please limit the daily donning of new respirators as much as possible (extended use, per policy, is strongly encouraged)
- Masks cannot be reprocessed if they are soiled with ANY amount of makeup, blood or body fluids.
 - PLEASE DO NOT WEAR MAKEUP DURING THIS SHORTAGE. Even a trace amount of foundation or lipstick can soil N95s.To conserve our supply of respirators, it is vital that all clinical staff refrain from wearing makeup that transfers to the N95s.
- Float staff You can choose to note your return location as your home department.
