#### Population Health Management: EPSDT/ Medi-Cal for Kids & Teens

The "Early and Periodic Screening, Diagnostic and Treatment (EPSDT)" program is a critical resource for Medicaid-enrolled children and adolescents under the age of 21, ensuring they receive comprehensive and preventive health care services. As of 2023, this program is known as "Medi-Cal for Kids & Teens" in California.

As a primary care provider (PCP), you play an essential role in delivering timely and effective care through EPSDT. You'll conduct screenings for medical, vision, hearing, and dental health in line with the *Bright Futures/American Academy of Pediatrics Periodicity Schedule*.

What is the goal of EPSDT? To identify and address health issues early, ensuring children and adolescents receive the necessary preventive, dental, mental health, developmental, and specialty services.

By federal law, EPSDT ensures that all medically necessary services are provided to correct or alleviate health conditions in eligible members. This includes:

# The Importance of Topical Fluoride for Children

Fluoride plays a critical role in protecting children's teeth from decay, and topical fluoride is one of the most effective tools in preventative dental care. According to the Dental Quality Alliance (DQA), professionally applied topical fluoride treatments are a safe and evidence-based method to strengthen enamel and prevent cavities, especially in children at moderate to high risk for dental caries.

Topical fluoride comes in forms like varnishes, gels, and foams that are applied directly to the teeth. These treatments work by remineralizing enamel and making teeth more resistant to acid attacks from plaque bacteria and sugars. The DQA emphasizes that fluoride varnish is particularly beneficial for children under 6, as it is quick to apply, well-tolerated, and has a strong track record of reducing decay.



Data-driven performance measures from the DQA highlight the importance of increasing access to topical fluoride applications. Regular treatments – typically every 3 to 6 months – can dramatically reduce the burden of dental disease and associated costs.

Providers are encouraged to speak with parents and caregivers about fluoride treatment as part of a comprehensive prevention plan. By prioritizing topical fluoride families can set a strong foundation for lifelong oral health. For more insights and evidence-based guidelines, click <u>here.</u>
