Monkeypox Medi-Cal Benefit

Dear Provider,

Department of Health Care Services (DHCS) released updates for Medi-Cal benefits testing, screening, and vaccinations for the Monkeypox disease.

Members may receive vaccines from Medi-Cal Pharmacies who should bill direct to Medi-Cal Rx.

If vaccine is provided by a physician in the physician's office and billing a medical claim, please use CPT code 87593 which will help to streamline the reporting of orthopoxvirus and monkeypox testing.

Testing:

• **87593**: Infectious agent detection by nucleic (DNA or RNA); orthopoxvirus (e.g., monkeypox virus, cowpox virus, vaccinia virus), amplified probe technique each.

Vaccinations

There are two vaccines that can be used for monkeypox virus infection:

- JYNNEOS (also known as Imvamune or Imvanex), is licensed (or approved) by the U.S. Food and Drug Administration (FDA) for the prevention of monkeypox virus infection
- ACAM2000, is licensed (or approved) by the FDA for use against smallpox and made available for use against monkeypox under an Expanded Access – Investigational New Drug Application

DHCS will continue to update and inform all Medi-Cal providers about testing and vaccinations related to monkeypox as guidance becomes available.
