Our Population Health Management Department at KFHC encourages our providers to assist our members with such challenges by utilizing the *Shared Decision-Making* (SDM) tool — developed by the Washington State Health Care Authority. This evidence-based approach empowers patients to make well-informed, personalized decisions about their breast cancer screenings.

The following Patient Decision Aids (PDAs) outline the importance of screening for different age groups:

# Inform Patients with Asthma about KFHC's new CHW and APS Services

Kern Family Health Care is thrilled to offer two new services to our members. Our members can now better their health with Community Health Worker (CHW) services

and Asthma Preventative Services (APS)!

Our Community Health Worker (CHW) services are services to help our members control chronic conditions, prolong living, and promote well-being within our community. CHW services encompass a wide range of preventive health measures, including health education, health navigation, non-clinical screening/assessments, and individual support/advocacy. Our goal is to empower individuals with the knowledge and resources they need to take charge of their



health. Eligibility criteria for CHW services include having a chronic disease, being at risk of developing a chronic disease, or having an unmet health-related social need.

We also offer Asthma Preventive Services (APS), which provide our members with educational information on asthma and equip them with the skills to effectively manage their condition.



Members with poorly controlled asthma—defined by specific criteria such as having an Asthma Control Test score of 19 or lower or recent emergency department visits—can benefit from an in-home trigger assessment to identify and mitigate asthma triggers.
