- Katie Johnson: Good morning, and welcome to Apple a Day, Lake Region Healthcare's health and wellness show where we feature news and information you can use to live a healthier life. I'm Katie Johnson, your host, and my guest today is Alyse Engen. She's a physician assistant who is joining our orthopedics and sports medicine team, and is joining us to introduce herself to our community and our patients this morning. Good morning Alyse.

- Alyse Engen, PA: I've always been intrigued with medicine, but orthopedics in particular, I love sports. I grew up playing sports, but I believe the physical health of a person is very important. In order for people to be able to do what they love, they need to be physically capable of doing that.

Katie Johnson:	Mm-hmm (affirmative) and orthopedics really gives you great opportunity to help people of all ages, really, whether it's a sports injury, or whether it's a hip or joint replacement later in life, right?	
Alyse Engen, PA:	Yeah. It really gives you that satisfaction of getting people back to the state of health that they were in before, being able to see them go back to the things that they enjoy doing.	
Katie Johnson:	Mm-hmm (affirmative). Absolutely, and what about choosing Lake Region Healthcare? Was there something in particular that drew you to choose to practice at Lake Region Healthcare once you got your physician assistant degree?

Alyse Engen, PA:	I enjoy all aspects of orthopedics, the surgical cases are particularly interesting to me. I think they provide the most satisfaction of seeing someone, you know, who has so much pain when they walk, or is incapable of doing some of those physical activities, and then watching them rehab afterward, and seeing the progress that they can make to go back to their daily lives.	
Katie Johnson:	What about when you're not working? What do you enjoy doing? You have some particular hobbies and interests?	
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Alyse Engen, PA:	I've always enjoyed playing basketball. I like spending time with family, heading out to the lakes, and traveling are probably my top favorite things to do.
Katie Johnson:	Great, anything else that you would like us to know about your practice or about yourself personally that you'd like to share with our listeners?
Alyse Engen, PA:	I actually just recently moved to the area, so I look forward to meeting a lot of new faces and getting to know the community.
Katie Johnson:	Well that's great. We certainly welcome you to the community. We welcome you to the family at Lake Region Healthcare, and we're just so glad to have you on the team.
