*Mental Health Services, defined

<u>ACT (Assertive Community Treatment)</u>: Community based, interdisciplinary approach to mental health stabilization and recovery, for people with Serious and Persistent Mental Illness (SPMI). Interdisciplinary team members usually include: psychiatry, nursing, ARMHS, case mgmt., psychotherapy, and chemical dependency specialist (if needed). This is not a service provided in Otter Tail County.

<u>Adult Mental Health Case Management:</u> Designed to assist qualified adults with medical, social, educational, vocational, and housing services within the community. For referral information or to see if the adult qualifies contact a case management provider from *Resource* list or Otter Tail County Human Services.

<u>Adult Rehabilitative Mental Health Services(ARMHS)</u>: Designed to develop and enhance psychiatric stability, social competencies, personal and emotional adjustment, and independent living skills, when these abilities are impaired by the symptoms of mental health. ARMHS participants must have MA or PMAP to qualify. For referral information or to see if the adult qualifies contact an ARMHS provider from *Resource* list.

<u>Community Support Professional (CSP)</u>: See description for ARMHS. CSP is for qualifying adults with private insurance. With CSP services there is more of a time limit on amount of services received by an individual. Contact a CSP provider from *Resource* list.

<u>Children's Therapeutic Support Services (CTSS)</u>: Designed to provide qualifying youth with support when they are struggling with issues related to their mental health or emotional difficulty. For referral information and to see if the youth qualify please contact a CTSS provider from *Resource* list.

<u>Children's Mental Health Case Management:</u> Designed to support youth with severe emotional disturbances and their families' access resources and services within the community. For referral information and to see if the youth qualifies contact a Children's Mental Health Case Management Provider from *Resource* list or Otter Tail County Human Services.

<u>Dialectical Behavioral Therapy (DBT)</u>: Group therapy designed to teach skills in mindfulness, interpersonal effectiveness, emotional regulation, and distress tolerance. These skills support participants in becoming more effective in managing extreme emotions, reducing self-harm, and inter-personal effectiveness. For more information contact Lakeland Mental Health Center.

Intensive Residential Treatment Services: 30-90 day intensive mental health support in a residential setting. Medical Assistance is needed to qualify as well as Mental Health Case Mgmt. These facilities are located state-wide, none locally.

<u>SED (Serious Emotional Disturbance)</u>: According to SAMHSA, "The term serious emotional disturbance (SED) is used to refer to children and youth who have had a diagnosable mental, behavioral, or emotional disorder in the past year, which resulted in functional impairment that substantially interferes with or limits the child's role or functioning in family, school, or community activities." (<u>https://www.samhsa.gov/disorders</u>). Most mental health services for children require this label.

<u>SMI (Serious Mental Illness)</u>: Adults 18 and over that have been diagnosed with a mental health issue that has caused functional impairment in the past 12 months.

<u>SPMI (Serious Persistent Mental Illness)</u>: A set of criteria established by MN Department of Human Services for adults 18 and over. Criteria includes: mental health diagnosis, number of inpatient hospitalizations within 24 months, commitments, etc. Some of the services named above require a diagnosis of SPMI or SMI to be eligible.
