As the Lincoln Hospital Foundation moves into a new decade, there is a renewed commitment and emphasis to help provide the best equipment and services possible for Lincoln Hospital and the clinics in Davenport, Reardan and Wilbur. The Foundation's Endowment Fund has been and continues to be a vital part of this commitment as we build for the future. Most recently the Foundation has been able to fund remodeling in the Transitional Care Unit and an entire new lab at the hospital.

Equipment and services for healthcare are becoming increasingly more expensive. In order to meet those needs, the Foundation's Endowment Fund has become a critical source of funding for immediate and long-term projects.

Our policy states that each year 75% of the interest and dividend income is set aside. Our investments are currently generating about \$90,000 in income using the investment firm of Richards, Merrill and Peterson in Spokane. Our goal is to provide at least \$200,000 or more in annual investment income as we team with Lincoln Hospital to meet current and long-term needs.

2020 Events & Activities

Thank you for your generosity in helping us to raise \$20,000 for the 2020 project - the purchase of new anesthesia equipment for Lincoln Hospital's surgical department and anesthesiologists. The new machine has the added benefit of providing medical air which is used as a substitute for nitrous oxide and optimal for patients sensitive to oxygen toxicity. This is also a safer method to deliver gases for anesthesia during surgical procedures. We are proud to have provided this despite barriers in our fundraising efforts due to Coronavirus. Women's Survivor Retreat: Due to Coronavirus restrictions, the retreat was cancelled. This retreat, supported by the Foundation's Project Pink Fund, is held annually in June at Turkey Ridge Ranch near Lake Roosevelt for women in Lincoln County who are cancer survivors. The overnight retreat includes guest speakers and group and individual sessions. The sessions offer various alternative health practitioners and opportunities for the women to relax, connect with other survivors, and get pampered. Medical Scholarship: Marie Braun started the Lincoln Hospital Foundation Medical Scholarship in 2008 with a vision to support the education of medical professionals who plan to return to rural healthcare. Since then numerous donors have contributed to the scholarship. We award a total amount of \$3,000 to students who have been accepted into any of the following programs: nursing, occupational therapy, physical therapy, pharmacy, and medicine. The 2020 recipients were Hannah Bandy of Wilbur (WSU School of Nursing); Karlee Maioho of Wilbur (Seattle University School of Nursing); and Peyton Van Pevenage of Davenport (University of Washington School of Medicine).
