

ASSOCIATE OF APPLIED SCIENCE NURSING: LPN-RN BRIDGE

The accelerated Licensed Practical Nurse (LPN) to Registered Nurse (RN) bridge track of the Associate of Applied Science in nursing is a one year, full-time program designed to build upon the previous experience and coursework of the student. The program prepares students for the National Council Licensing Examination for Registered Nursing (NCLEX-RN) and incorporates valuable hands-on opportunities throughout clinical and classroom settings along with individualized instruction from faculty. Upon completing the program, students are prepared to work in a variety of settings and/or transition into a BSN completion program.



Accelerated beginning each summer

Admission Requirements

- NLN Nursing Acceleration Challenge Exam I (NACE I) with a score of 75% or higher
- LPN license (a current license must be maintained throughout the program. Students currently enrolled in LPN programs have 90 days after graduation to provide a copy)

NACE Information

The National League for Nursing (NLN) offers the Nursing Acceleration Challenge Exam (NACE) which provides diagnostic evaluation of the student's nursing knowledge. The NACE is offered locally at the Cape Girardeau Career and Technology Center. For additional information and testing sites, please contact the admissions office.

Admission Process

The admission process will not begin until all application materials are received. Materials are not reviewed before this time. Applications are accepted on a continuous basis and seats are offered first come, first serve to students who meet the admission requirements. **All application materials are due on Monday, by 5:00 PM, 4 weeks prior to the start of the program or the semester students wish to begin.** Applications that are not complete by this deadline will be rolled over to the next program start date or semester.

Direct-entry no prerequisites required



Cost and Financial Aid

As a part of the admission and enrollment process, students will incur the following costs upfront:

- \$50 application fee
- \$100 seat retainer (deposit)
- \$93 CastleBranch fee

Accreditation

Accredited by the Accreditation Commission for Education in Nursing (ACEN) with full approval of the Missouri State Board of Nursing. Required general education courses are built into the program but can be taken separately. Program courses must be taken in the order listed. Students can begin taking general education courses the semester after they are admitted.

All courses require a C or better to be considered passing.

FYS 101 and AH 201 must be completed at SoutheastHEALTH College of Nursing and Health Sciences. Other general education courses may be transferred in.
