



The Associate of Applied Science in Nursing is designed to prepare students for the National Council Licensing Examination for Registered Nursing (NCLEX-RN). The program incorporates valuable hands-on opportunities throughout clinical and classroom settings along with individualized instruction from faculty. Upon completing the program, students are prepared to work in a variety of settings and/or transition into a BSN completion program.

## Admission Requirements

**Direct Admission** (students with less than 25 hours of college credit):

- Cumulative high school GPA of 2.50 on a 4.0 scale
- Cumulative college GPA of 2.50 on a 4.0 scale (if applicable)
- ACT composite score of 21 or SAT score of 1060 (if age 22 or younger)
- ATI TEAS score of 70% or higher with a minimum science score of 45%

**OR**

**Transfer Admission** (students with 25 or more completed hours of college credit):

- Cumulative college GPA of 2.50 on a 4.0 scale
- ATI TEAS score of 70% or higher with a minimum science score of 45%

## TEAS Information

The ATI Test of Essential Academic Skills (TEAS) is a computer-based exam that is designed to assess a student's preparedness to enter the health science field.

The TEAS is offered locally at the Cape Girardeau Career and Technology Center. For additional information and testing sites, please contact our admissions office.

## Admission Process

The admission process will not begin until all application materials are received. Materials are not reviewed before this time. Applications are accepted on a continuous basis and seats are offered first come, first serve to students who meet the admission requirements. **All application materials are due on Monday, by 5:00 PM, 4 weeks prior to the start of the program or the semester students wish to begin taking courses.** Applications that are not completed by this deadline will be rolled over to the next program start date or semester.

## Cost and Financial Aid

As a part of the admission and enrollment process, students will incur the following costs upfront:

- \$50 application fee
- \$100 seat retainer (deposit)
- \$93 CastleBranch fee

Tuition is the same for Missouri and non-Missouri residents. Tuition costs for the basic nursing program along with program fees can be found at:

Grants and loans are available to students who complete a FAFSA and qualify. Additional information about financial aid may be obtained from our Financial Aid Director or by visiting our website.

Required general education courses are built into the program but can be taken separately. Program courses must be taken in the order listed. Students can begin taking general education courses the semester after they are admitted.

All courses require a C or better to be considered passing.

FYS 101 and AH 201 must be completed at SoutheastHEALTH College of Nursing and Health Sciences. Other general education courses may be transferred in.
