

ASSOCIATE OF APPLIED SCIENCE NURSING: PARAMEDIC-RN BRIDGE


The part-time paramedic to Registered Nurse (RN) bridge track of the Associate of Applied Science in Nursing is an evening/weekend program designed to build upon the previous experience and coursework of the student. The program prepares students for the National Council Licensing Examination for Registered Nursing (NCLEX-RN) and incorporates valuable hands-on opportunities throughout clinical and classroom settings along with individualized instruction from faculty. Upon completing the program, students are prepared to work in a variety of settings and/or transition into a BSN completion program.

Admission Requirements

Direct Admission (students with less than 25 hours of college credit):

- cumulative high school GPA of 2.50 on a 4.0 scale
- cumulative college GPA of 2.50 on a 4.0 scale (if applicable)
- ACT composite score of 21 or SAT score of 1060 (if age 22 or younger)
- minimum one year of Paramedic work experience
- current Paramedic license

OR

Transfer Admission (students with 25 or more completed hours of college credit):

- cumulative college GPA of 2.50 on a 4.0 scale
- minimum one year of paramedic work experience
- current paramedic license

Admission Process

The admission process will not begin until all application materials are received. Materials are not reviewed before this time. Applications are accepted on a continuous basis and seats are offered first come, first serve to students who meet the admission requirements. **All application materials are due on** <u>Monday, by 5:00 PM, 4 weeks prior</u> to the start of the program or the semester students wish to begin taking courses. Applications that are not completed by this deadline will be rolled over to the next start date or semester.

Cost and Financial Aid

As a part of the admission and enrollment process, students will incur the following costs upfront:

- \$50 application fee
- \$100 seat retainer (deposit)
- \$93 CastleBranch fee

The part-time track has evening/weekend courses that begin at 4:00 PM or later Monday-Friday and clinicals or labs every other weekend (weekends are daytime and evening hours Saturday and Sunday).

Required general education courses are built into the program but can be taken separately. Program courses must be taken in the order listed. Students can begin taking general education courses the semester after they are admitted.

All courses require a C or better to be considered passing.

FYS 101 and AH 201 must be completed at SoutheastHEALTH College of Nursing and Health Sciences. Other general education courses may be transferred in.
